Poison Show To Be Given

A demonstration of the use of poisoned salt to kill porcupines will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday at the Bill Burnett ranch on the west Langell Valley Road.

The demonstration will be conducted by Willard E. Nelson, assistant district agent of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at Bend. Nelson is delivering 100 blocks of the poisoned salt to the Langell Valley Soil Conservation District, which purchased it to use in an attempt to control porcupines in wooded areas of the district.

Burnett, a member of the Board of Supervisors of the district, said that Saturday's demonstration would be open to the public.
