Pilgrims Pled To Bethlehem

JERUSALEM (Israeli sector). (UP)—Hundreds of Christmas pilgrims plodded today along the dusty road to Bethlehem, through villages torn three days ago by rioting and gunfire.

A bright sunshine streamed down on the little town where Christ was born and there were few signs of the bloody riot that the Arab Legionnaires of Jordan suppressed with machineguns and tear gas.

By a.m. some 400 Christian Israelis, Arabs, monks and nuns had crossed the Israeli-Jordan lines and moved into Jordan through an ancient Mandelbaum Gate.

Anti-government demonstrations by Jordanians angered at their country's threatened adherence to the Baghdad Pact sealed off Bethlehem last week, but today there was almost no hindrance to the religious procession.

A few would-be pilgrims were refused entry permits by Jordanian authorities holding forth in a series of customs and immigration tents set up at right angles to the Mandelbaum Gate.

Israeli authorities said some pilgrims had stayed on the Israeli side of the border for fear of getting caught up in further Jordanian rioting.

White-painted United Nations jeeps buzzed along the road the three wise men took nearly 2,000 years ago, but except for the ruins left by the 1948 war there was little or no sign of strife.

The pilgrims crossing from Israel today were mostly Christian Arabs from the north—from Galilee and from Nazareth where Christ once plied his trade as a carpenter.

Overseas tourists, including a large number of Americans, will not cross into Jordan until Saturday, Christmas Eve, when the U.N. consular corps will travel together to Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity for the traditional Christmas ceremony.

Normally the road they travel is closed, for it lies close to the barbed wire barricades and minefields of the Israeli-Jordan border.
