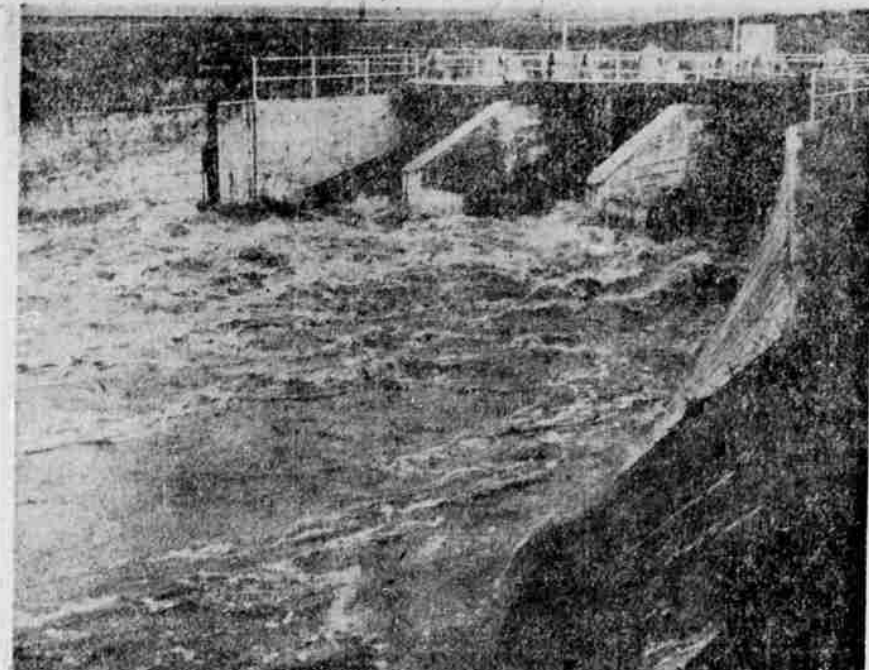

National Fires Kill 23 On Eve Of Christmas Day

Fires across the nation have killed 23 persons; most of them children, on the eve of the Christmas holiday celebration.

All but 10 of the fire victims yesterday were children eagerly awaiting the excitement and gifts of Christmas.

Ten-them fires in St. Louis and New York City both killed two youngsters. Three Indianapolis children died in their flaming tarpaper home and three more were killed in a Davenport, Iowa, fire.

A Nashville, Tenn., blaze took the lives of two children and another tot died in an Ohio fire.

Other fire victims included an 80-year-old Clinton, Iowa, woman; a deckhand on a freighter at Manitowoc, Wis.; a fire chief fighting a refinery blaze at Warren, Pa.; and Mrs. John V. W. Falck, one-time society editor of the Panama City, Fla., News-Herald.

The New York tenement fire killed two adults and three more died in Ohio blazes. Another victim was counted in the St. Louis fire.

The National Board of Fire Underwriters meanwhile warned that winter is the most dangerous time of the year for fires and the Christmas season is even more hazardous.

The highest fire losses are recorded from December to March, the board said. And on Christmas, when homes are jammed with gifts and merry-makers, the chances of tragedy jump higher.

The underwriters recommended these safety precautions during the holidays:

1. Make sure that your Christmas tree is not too big and that your lighting fixtures are in good shape. Don't let the tree stand in the living room too long before or after Christmas. Place it in the coolest part of the room and never use candles as decorations.
2. Make sure that your children's new toys are safe.
3. If you're planning Christmas parties, be sure there are plenty of ash trays and keep a close eye on guests who become too full of holiday spirits. Check your stove to be sure it's clean.

For portable heaters, electric heaters can overload your circuits and oil-burning heaters should always be filled outdoors and kept away from drapes and furniture.

Train Groups Install Officers
