Modoc Deputy Sheriff Raps System Of Open Doe Season

TULELAKE — Gerald C. Wilson, Modoc County deputy sheriff who assisted game law enforcement officers during the open doe season in Modoc County that opened December 10 and ended December 18, has issued a protest over the "mismanagement of the shoot by the California State Branch of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the senseless slaughter of the California-Oregon inter-state deer herd."

Wilson stated that the area in Northern Modoc County opened to the shoot is the natural feeding

ground of deer and that the animals were congregating in that area in great numbers before the dates set for the season.

He challenged the accuracy of the annual inter-state count which is accomplished by dragging a section of the state line road where deer normally cross and then counting the tracks.

"Those who make the tally," Wilson said, "forget a deer has four legs and do not divide the total by four." He said the last 22,000 head estimate was far too high.

"If California feels the open doe season is the answer to control a too rapid an increase in deer numbers that fish and game officials are interested in and the conservation of deer browse," Wilson said, "the government service should investigate why plenty of feed is not available for the deer."

Bitterbrush and sagebrush in natural deer habitat in the Lava Beds and other nearby feeding grounds is dying. Sheep are grazed in considerable numbers in these areas and Wilson suggested that there may be some relation between the sheep feeding and the dying flora through a parasitical insect transmitted through droppings. Other flora in the same general area is not affected.

The officer also protested dates of the season which come after the rutting season; the "irresponsible shooting," practically on the doorsteps of ranch homes, the lack of policing facilities provided for law enforcement officers and the overlapping of authority.

He cited numerous instances of law breaking, including the finding of a number of bucks killed out of season.

An estimated 3,600 animals were killed during the doe season.

Grand Jury Plans Cases

Alleged law violators held in the county jail whose cases are slated for grand jury consideration include: George Leffew, forgery; Charles Krug, assault with a dangerous weapon; Billy Richardson, rape; Phillip Beeson, sodomy; Ray Martin, forgery; William Brogdon, forgery; Earl Larson, burglary; and Ralph Houck, bogus checks.

Others whose cases will be probed are: Leonard Lugo, assault with a dangerous weapon; Jack Gordon, rape; John Curry, larceny by bailee; Keith Wolf, forgery; Dee Ann Wolf, bogus checks; Kenneth (Dusty) Wells, assault with a dangerous weapon; Alfred Lugo, assault with a dangerous weapon; C. Reyes Files Appeal Motion

CORVALLIS (AP) — Martin B. Reyes, 23, Seattle, sentenced to life imprisonment, has filed a motion for a new trial in circuit court here.

Reyes was convicted Dec. 13 of second degree murder in the death of James R. Applegate, 39, Oct. 24, 1953.

Reyes' attorneys, in filing the motion, listed 17 alleged errors at law they assert were permitted in the trial.

The motion specified, however, that if a new trial is granted it is to be on no charge higher than murder in the second degree.
