

## Committee Tells Red Party Aims

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate Internal Security subcommittee described the Communist party of the United States today as "a Russian inspired, Moscow-dominated, anti-American, quasimilitary conspiracy against our government, our ideals and our freedoms."

The description was provided in a 100-page booklet, "A Handbook for Americans," put out by the subcommittee with the avowed aim of exposing what communism really is.

The subcommittee quoted the Subversive Activities Control Board's finding in 1953 that the U.S. Communist party is "substantially directed, dominated and controlled by the Soviet Union."

Chairman Eastland (D-Miss.) said in a foreword: "The average American is unaware of the amount of misinformation about the Communist Party U.S.A. which appears in the public press, in books and in utterances of public speakers. In part, this misinformation is planted consciously by members of the party, using ways and means calculated to have the greatest effect in poisoning the channels of American public opinion."

"In part, it is due to our ignorance of the problem—the problem of the existence in our midst of a mass conspiratorial organization controlled by a foreign power. The Communist problem is unique in our history."

"We earnestly believe that, given a more accurate knowledge of the Communist conspiracy, fewer Americans will fall victim to its wiles."

The handbook quotes from Communist doctrine in hearings before SACB, its own subversive investigations and those of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, "to differentiate the Communist party from bona fide political parties in the United States."

## GI Disappears In East Berlin

BERLIN (AP)—An American Air Force sergeant from Paris who visited Berlin over Christmas, has disappeared in the Soviet sector of Berlin after an automobile accident, U.S. officials disclosed Tuesday.

The Army said M. Sgt. Mike Kilman, Brooklyn, N.Y., was involved in a crash Monday night and was last seen being taken from a hospital by Communist police.

Preliminary inquiry failed to locate Kilman's whereabouts. A request is being sent to the Russians to look into the case.

## Korea Maps Rescue Plans

SEOUL (AP)—South Korea's army, air force and navy leaders met in a top secret session today to map their next move to recover four coast guardmen grabbed by Red China Christmas Day.

South Korea has called the Yellow Sea incident "an act of war."

Dr. Hong Kee Kari, official government spokesman, said yesterday his country will resort to "the strongest possible action" if the seamen are not returned.

The government said the action occurred within the Rhee Line, the boundary of waters claimed as South Korean territory. The line runs an average of 60 miles from the Korean coast, but extends up to 200 miles offshore in some places.

The four men were seized early Sunday after a five-hour gun battle between an ROK patrol craft and six Red Chinese patrol boats.

The South Korean government gave this version:

The cutter seized one of some 14 Red vessels fishing inside the Rhee Line, put four coast guardmen aboard and took the fishing boat in tow. Six armed Chinese ships then appeared and opened fire. The Chinese boats left after

the gun duel, with the four coast guardmen on board.

A Peiping radio broadcast, heard in Tokyo, said the ROK cutter opened fire on the Chinese boats which were attempting to rescue the seized craft. The broadcast also said the South Korean boat captured two Chinese fishermen.

Maritime Office Director Hong Jin Ki flatly denied the Peiping version.

## Stevenson Supporters Seek 'Liberal' Veep Candidate

WASHINGTON (AP)—Supporters confident that Adlai E. Stevenson will win the Democratic presidential nomination were reported quietly canvassing the field today in search of a vice presidential candidate generally regarded as "liberal."

Stevenson himself apparently is taking no part in this move.

But some of those closely associated with the former Illinois governor when he ran in 1952 and who are working for him now have been discussing possible candidates with the aim of offering what they call a balanced ticket.

Their view, as explained by one of them, is that Stevenson has charted the middle of the road as his course and will carry a "moderate" label into the Chicago convention next August.

This is calculated in part to make him more appealing to Southern delegates than in 1952. It also is geared to what Stevenson himself has said is the spirit of the times and, by inference, the best vote-catching appeal in the November election.

But there are signs that some elements of the Democratic party—particularly organized labor—be-

lieve that "moderation" easily could drift into stagnation of social gains, which Stevenson has said should not be allowed to occur.

To offset this, some of Stevenson's supporters think that if their candidate wins the top place on the ticket, it will be more important to have a vice presidential nominee who bears the label of "liberal" than it will be to satisfy geographical and other considerations.

In this connection they have been discussing such men as Governors Robert B. Meyner of New Jersey and George M. Leader of Pennsylvania, former Gov. Chester Bowles of Connecticut and others.
