Potato Seed Lots Listed

Greenhouse space for test planting of uncertified potato seed lots will become available around the first of the year, according to H. E. Finnell, who heads Oregon's seed certification program.

Klamath growers who wish this service are urged to submit samples early to take advantage of the opportunity for earlier returns.

Production of foundation and certified netted gem seed from 538 acres which passed field and digging time inspection in 1955 is estimated at 120,000 bags.

Based on past experience, County Extension Agent Walt Jendrzewski expects some of this stock to lose certification eligibility in the greenhouses. To date reports have been received for eight gem seed lots. Three rated foundation. Four rated certified. One lot failed to meet the one per cent greenhouse tolerance for leafroll.

According to Jendrzewski, a high percentage of commercial lots in the county are considered to carry too much leaf roll for safe use as planting stock. Last year more than one-half the commercial samples test planted were reported to carry more than two per cent leaf roll infection. Many such lots were discarded.

But many commercial fields were planted with stock carrying one to two per cent leaf roll infection. Production from such fields is extremely unlikely to be suitable seed for commercial planting.

Suppliers of foundation and certified gem seed in Klamath County are likely to be short of the county's needs.

Late decisions not to plant commercial stock may find foundation and certified seed supplies very short.

The United Press reported from Salem, today that the secretary of the Oregon State Highway Commission announced that the contract award for the Klamath Falls viaduct project has not been made but that details with the Southern Pacific Company have now been ironed out and that the contract award will be made soon.

The apparent low bid of Tom Lillabo, Reedport, of \$399,964 was tentatively approved by the state highway commission last week. The final awarding of the contract is usually done after the state highway engineer's office studies the plans of the low bidder and gives final approval. In most cases, the bid is awarded to the lowest bidder.

He worked as a blacksmith and laborer on the Grand Trunk Pacific Railroad from Prince George, British Columbia to Prince Rupert until 1915. He came to this region soon after that date.

A nephew, Peter Scarich, Kinnebrew, Minnesota, is in Klamath Falls for the funeral of his uncle. There are no other surviving relatives.

Final rites and interment will be in Klamath Memorial Park.
