



NO NEED TO WAIT until the last minute to prepare that plate of mouth-watering hors d'oeuvres for a party. Make them up in advance and store them in the food freezer, as demonstrated by this alert homemaker with her new Frigidaire. Moisture-vapor-proof material should be used as wrapper around the plate. Remember, too, that chopped hard cooked eggs should not be used for canapes or appetizers that you are going to freeze.



A GLAMOROUS TOUCH to your special dessert is the goal of many hostesses. To gain a reputation for doing things just a little differently is most desirable. The National Dairy Council suggests this flaming Sundae. The idea comes from the Pump Room in Chicago and the Waldorf Hotel in New York.



HANDSOME PLAID jacket is in the Princess Elizabeth plaid combining brown, white and bright blue. The jacket body is long-wearing Du Pont Nylon taffeta with brown nylon rib knitting at neck, wrists and waist. The warm lining is of nylon fleece in light tan and the jacket may be washed and drip dried.

UNWANTED PRESENT PROBLEM
When the gift wrappings have been disposed of and the first mention is made of dismantling the tree, the perennial problem presents itself: What to do about unwanted and unsuitable Christmas gifts?
Clothing items that are duplications or entirely unsuitable to the rest of the wardrobe can usually be exchanged.
How about exchanging the gift for a waterproof jacket or raincoat? A new raincoat shown is in a rugged fabric of 50 per cent "Dacron" polyester fiber, 50 per cent cotton. These hold their shape so well that many men will wear them as topcoats on mild days. Soiling is less apparent and the dark color lends itself to wearing as a topcoat.
Fabrics of "Dacron" have an amazing ability to ease out the wrinkles of wear. These raincoats can be washed and after washing they recover their shape with little or no ironing. The best practice is to hang the wet, freshly washed garment on a non-staining hanger and allow it to drip dry.
Another version of the conventional "self contained" garment is a zipper front jacket of nylon taffeta. It has the appearance of the standard nylon golf jacket, but there is a zipper across the inside back of the jacket which opens to a similar self-contained package.

When the wearer wants to store it in his golf bag or car glove compartment, he opens the fastener, folds the jacket upon itself into this compartment and presto, the jacket is a little bundle ready for storing.

GI Pleads Guilty To Desertion
FRANKFURT, Germany (AP) — An American Army private pleaded guilty Wednesday to deserting to Communist East Germany with his German girl friend. He was sentenced to two years at hard labor.
A seven-member general court martial imposed the sentence on Kenneth D. Miller, 29, of San Francisco.
The court deliberated only 10 minutes.
The sentence also includes a dishonorable discharge and loss of all pay and allowances.
Miller crossed into East Germany April 21, 1954, with Irme-gard Bamberg. They were nabbed by Russian troops after they got only 50 yards inside Communist controlled territory. Later the Communists let him work at an automobile plant in East Germany.
Miller returned voluntarily last Sept. 3.

FLAMING SUNDAE
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup water
1/4 cup chopped maraschino cherries
1 cup prepared mince meat
1/4 cup cut-up nuts
six sugar cubes
lemon extract
1 quart vanilla ice cream
Combine sugar and water in saucepan and boil for five minutes. Remove from heat and add cherries, mince meat and nuts. Cool. Divide ice cream into six servings. Spoon cold sauce over the ice cream. Dip sugar cubes into lemon extract, push down slightly on the very top of the ice cream and ignite. Serve flaming.
