Brazil Paper Reports Censors

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil - One of Rio de Janeiro's leading morning newspapers failed to appear Thursday and blamed delays in military censorship.

An official of Correio da Manha said the proof of page 6 of the paper still was at the War Ministry two hours after the press run usually starts.

Censorship to prevent criticism of the legality of Brazil's provisional government was decreed last month. The opposition newspaper Diario de Noticias was raided Wednesday and all copies of that day's issue seized because it published an editorial critical of censorship.

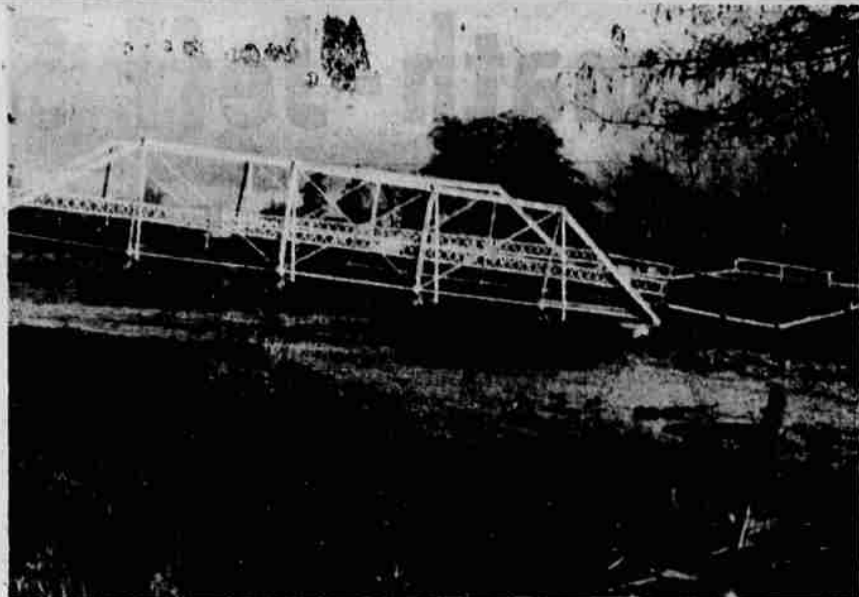

Lloyd Summons British Envoys

LONDON - Foreign Secretary Lloyd has summoned home Britain's envoys in the turbulent Middle East for consultations next week. The Foreign Office announced Thursday. The action by Britain's new foreign secretary indicated Middle Eastern affairs will figure prominently in the discussion later next month when Prime Minister Eden and Lloyd travel to Washington to meet President Eisenhower and U.S. Secretary of State Dulles.

The London meeting of British envoys will take place against a background of secret British diplomatic efforts in the main capitals of the Middle East to bring about peace between Israel and the Arab world. The Foreign Office announcement said British diplomatic representatives have been summoned from Egypt, Iraq, Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Israel, Saudi Arabia and the Persian Gulf territories.

Nike Missile Defense Set For Europe

WASHINGTON (UP) - The Nike anti-aircraft guided missile is the next advanced weapon likely to be sent to Europe to strengthen Western defenses, it was learned today. The missile itself probably will not be sent overseas for more than a year. But in the meantime, launching sites, including underground storage rooms, will be constructed for the Nike.

The supersonic missile, which already is protecting 18 major cities in the United States, will be assigned to U.S. forces stationed in Europe. Its primary mission will be to guard the string of U.S. bases there, particularly in Germany. But it also probably will be used in helping protect major West European cities.

Present plans do not call for furnishing any West European forces with the Nike, although the Allies will be informed about the capabilities of the weapon. There is a possibility West European nations may even be given sufficient information about the weapon so they can produce it themselves if they want to.

The plan to send Nike missile units to Europe reflects (1) the near completion of the first phase of affording anti-aircraft protection to major U.S. cities, (2) the growing demand of smaller European nations for greater access to advanced weapons developed by the United States and Great Britain, and (3) the determination to equip North Atlantic Treaty Organization forces with the most modern weapons, including nuclear weapons.

The Nike, which has a high kill capability against enemy bombers up to 25 miles away, is the only operational Army missile not yet supplied to U.S. Army forces in Europe. The missile would be of obvious value in providing a last-ditch defense in an area such as Germany where advance warning of an enemy attack would be difficult because of the closeness of Communist air bases.

Tacoma Firm Buys Timber

YREKA - The Pondsosa Unit of timber in southern Siskiyou County was sold to the Cheney-Sierra Lumber Company of Tacoma. The sale was announced by N. E. Doile, timber management officer for the Shasta-Trinity national forests.

The unit includes 6,450,000 board feet, principally white and Douglas fir. It is an excellent sugar pine growing site and has been treated by the forest service to prevent the spread of white pine blister rust. This sale is designed to remove the residual old growth stand of fir and thereby promote better growing conditions for pine. The timber was appraised at \$83,611.50, including \$1,612.50 for hard reduction and \$31,400 for stand improvement work. Twenty-five per cent of the stumpage receipts from this and other national forest timber sales is distributed to the counties in which the national forest lies. This includes Modoc, Siskiyou, Shasta and Trinity counties.
