One 9-inch unbaked pastry shell

Beat eggs slightly; add sugar, salt, milk, vanilla extract and nutmeg. Pour into pastry shell. Bake in hot oven 425 deg. F., 40 minutes or until inserted knife comes out clean. Makes 6 servings.
