Ferry, Train Replace Road

ROSEBURG (AP)—A ferry and a train will be used to replace slide-blocked Highway 33 near Reedsport. Officials have arranged to use an old tugboat as a ferry to carry passengers around the slide. It will operate 13 hours a day between Reedsport and Dean's Creek, two miles to the east.

A Southern Pacific train will become a school bus, running between Reedsport and a point about three miles south of town. Children, who have been unable to reach school, can get to that point by bus and be carried into town by the train. City Manager Al Rear of Reedsport estimated the cost of a train

service at \$400 a day, but the Southern Pacific said it would do the job for \$100 a day. And so children who have not been in school for two weeks can start back Monday.

Highway 33 has been blocked two weeks by a mammoth slide, which still is moving. As fast as workers dig into, more mud flows down.

Ormond Bean To Seek Mayor Post

PORTLAND (AP)—Ormond R. Bean, 70, city finance commissioner and former state public utilities commissioner, Sunday announced he will run for mayor in the May election. Mayor Fred L. Peterson, whose term expires this year, would not say whether he will seek reelection. But, commenting on Bean's announcement, he said, "This is the time to expect that sort of thing, isn't it?" Last Friday Terry Schunk, Multnomah County sheriff, said he had been asked to run for mayor and he said neither yes nor no. He frequently has been mentioned as a candidate for the Democratic nomination as secretary of state. Earlier a publicity agent and showman, Earl Messman, had announced his candidacy for mayor.
