Jehovah's Witnesses End Three-Day Circuit Assembly

Undaunted by snow and icy roads, 812 people turned out at the fairgrounds auditorium Sunday to hear Nicholas Kovalak Jr. declare in the widely advertised Bible lecture, "Overcoming the Fears of This Generation," that the number, variety and intensity of the fears which beset this generation are enormous. There is the fear of neighbor, political systems, wars, insecurity, disease, death, the fear of the atom, hydrogen, cobalt and perhaps now the uranium bomb.

He then proceeded to show that neither the politicians nor the United Nations or even the clergy can dispel this climate of fear. "The U.N. holds no remedy, but fear and doubt hold permanent seats in the United Nations Organization," he added.

Mr. Kovalak pointed out from the Bible that the main cause of all these fears is Satan the Devil. "Accurate knowledge of God's Word, faith and perfect love of God and right principles are the prime essentials for overcoming the fears of this generation," he emphasized.

"Rather than be paralyzed by the fear that this earth may be destroyed by thermonuclear weapons men should fear what the Great Creator, Jehovah God can and will do by his great Battle of Armageddon, when the wicked and all their wickedness will be forever wiped off the face of the earth, even fear will be done away with."

So he encouraged all, irrespective of their religious beliefs, to study, not only read, God's Word the Bible, the only true source of hope and comfort. Honest hearted persons must learn the reasons for these fears and learn to rely on the promises of Jehovah, then tell others, as Christians should, out of love.

Following the public discourse was a summary of the Dec. 1, 1955 "Watchtower" magazine by Roger Lewis of Grants Pass, covering the lesson, "Avoidance Inside the Cities of Refuge."

Expressions by delegates of Oregon Circuit No. 1 who attended the 1955 "Triumphal Kingdom Assemblies" held in London, Paris, Rome, Nuremberg, Stockholm and The Hague, were highlighted by color motion pictures and slides. These European convention expressions were conducted by Lawrence Kraushaar, convention chairman.

The final session of the "Right Kind of Ministers" Circuit Assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses was concluded by the discourse, "Keep Your Balance in All Things" by Nicholas Kovalak. Mr. Kovalak pointed out that dedication to do the will of Jehovah, the Almighty God, is the highest and noblest of human ambitions. It is the course which must be followed by all to gain everlasting life in God's promised New World of righteousness. All the Witnesses were encouraged on returning to their respective congregations to continue their ministerial training and preaching; helping others to overcome the fears of this generation through study of the Bible, as the right kind of ministers.

Pact Delegates Meet In Iraq

BAGHDAD, Iraq (UP)—Delegates from five Baghdad Pact nations and teams of atomic experts met here today to study means of putting teeth in the anti-Communist alliance that links Britain, Turkey, Iraq, Iran and Pakistan.

Hopes of drawing Jordan into the pact dimmed following a weekend of rioting there against the pact and a declaration by new Jordan Premier Samir el Rifa that he would not "indulge in high politics like negotiating foreign alliances."

The two-day meeting of the pact members was the first "working session" since the British foreign minister and prime ministers of the four other nations formally set up the "northern tier" defense group last Nov. 21.

The Baghdad Pact, which has the backing of the United States—

represented by observers — was formed to counter any Communist aggression in the Middle East. It stretches across the southern frontier of Russia.
