FURNITURE MARKET

Tailored, lightly scaled furniture designed for smaller homes is being shown by Kroehler Manufacturing Company at the January furniture market in Chicago this month.

Adaptable sectionals will highlight these groupings with many versatile arrangements possible to make the most effective use of available area.

In addition to examples of the Copenhagen collection shown here, reflecting the Scandinavian influence, the American collection will be featured. Both will be available in two color ranges — one showing a far Eastern jewel tone influence, the other, earth tones.

A subdued and more subtle use of metallics is an important trend. Most of the fabrics have a hand-woven look.

Clear tone colors rather than greyed-down shades will predominate in the upholsteries in both the Kroehler and Valentine Seaver Originals collection.

Kroehler, which is the world's

largest furniture manufacturer is the largest purchaser of upholstery fabric outside of the automobile field. The company uses some six million yards annually.

In an analysis of color preferences for the coming season, Edward Fricker, head of Kroehler's upholstery procurement division, said he felt that turquoise would again be the first color choice.

He said, however, that the preference would be toward clear toned green-turquoises, rather than those with blue shadings. Bright yellows, greens, clear earth tones like beige and brown will dominate the color field.

Rose, which has been gaining strength in past seasons, will continue to be popular on traditional furniture, but it is not a "modern" color, Fricker said.



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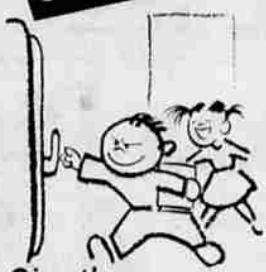
NEW BLINDS

Venetian blinds have been taking on new designs in the past few years and now the latest look is that of lace. The slats are made of aluminum in neutral colors, such as white with a gray lace pattern or beige with a white lace pattern. They are washable, of course. And homemakers will also welcome the use of plastic tape which wipes clean with the stroke of a spongy sponge on cloth.

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NEW ENGLAND CORN PUDDING is a timely dish for winter. The recipe for this savory, easy-to-fix dish was adapted from an old-fashioned recipe in the Minute Maid Snow Crop Frozen Foods Test Kitchen.

BANANAS Accompany fried chicken with bananas which have been baked in a hot oven to heat through. For added flavor, baste the bananas with a molasses-butter dip.

NEW ENGLAND CORN PUDDING

Frozen foods make life easy for the homemaker during the winter months when fresh vegetable are out of season. Corn, for example, is a wonderful vegetable to serve with the heartier meat dishes of wintertime. A 10-ounce package of frozen corn is required for this casserole pudding dish.

CORN PUDDING
4 tablespoons butter or margarine
3 tablespoons flour
2 cups milk
1 teaspoon salt
3/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 package frozen corn
1 cup boiling water
3 eggs, separated.
Melt butter or margarine in heat

BOWL
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vy pan over moderate heat. Remove from heat and stir in flour to form a smooth mixture. Add milk slowly stirring constantly. Add salt and cayenne pepper. Return to heat, stirring constantly until mixture boils. Remove from heat. Pour boiling water over frozen corn, stirring lightly with a fork until kernels separate. Drain. Add corn kernels to white sauce. Beat egg yolks until light. Stir into corn mixture. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold carefully into mixture. Pour into greased 2 quart heat proof casserole. Bake in moderate oven (350 F.) 1 hour. Serve at once. Serves 6-8.



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
