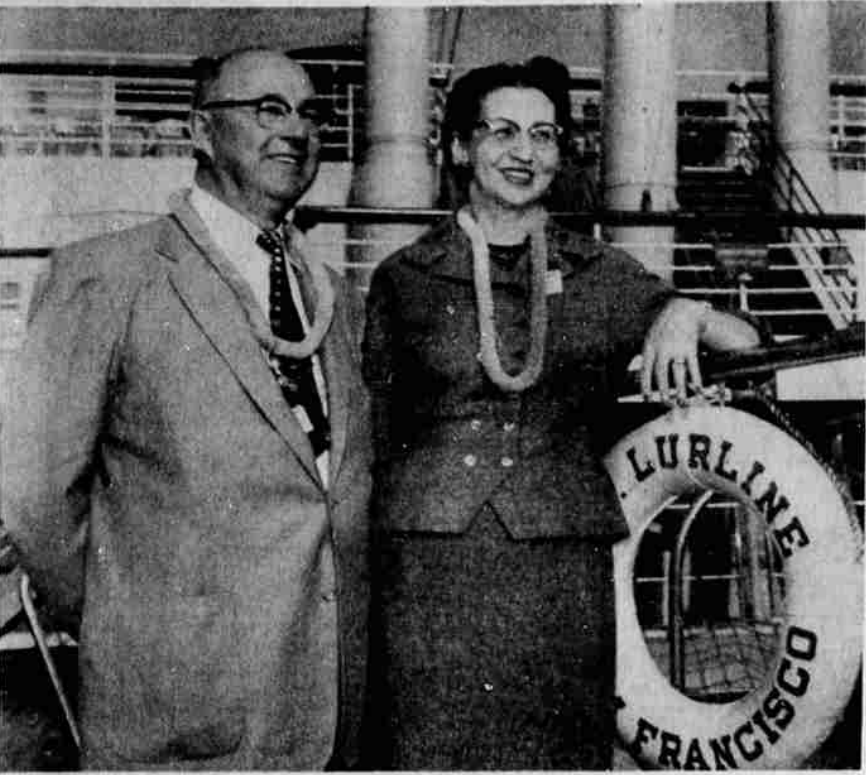

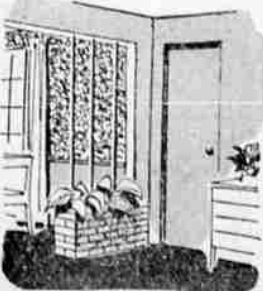

Relate Adjoining Rooms

Before you decide on the color scheme for individual rooms, it's a good idea to consider the house as a whole — to correlate the overall scheme. If your home is small, it's often advisable to use one basic color and carry this color in varying shades throughout all the rooms. If you do this, you'll want to introduce variety with contrasting color accents of paint and/or wallpaper. If you are treating rooms individually, be sure to relate adjoining rooms by carrying color in an interesting manner from one room to another. This has been done in the accompanying sketch. Living room walls have been painted a soft avocado green. This shade has been carried into the adjoining dining room in draperies, foliage patterned wallpaper, and on the painted dado.

MERRILL—St. Augustine's Altar Society regular meeting, Wednesday, January 4, was at 1 p.m. in the parish hall.

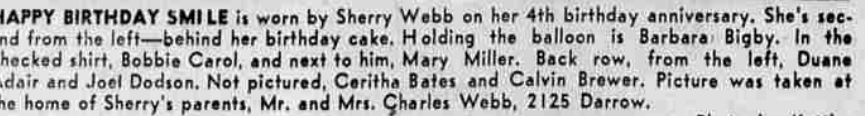
