Oakland Mayor Asks Secession

OAKLAND (UP) — Oakland's vice-mayor believes the city should secede from Alameda County.

This suggestion came Friday from Frank J. Youell, a veteran city councilman, at a caucus preceding the regular city council meeting.

He said Oakland should secede from Alameda County and reorganize as a separate city and county like San Francisco to avoid double taxation and overlapping and duplication of government costs.

Youell noted that Oakland taxpayers pay about 60 per cent of the cost of county government, although the city occupies only about 53 square miles of the county's 840 square mile area.

Other councilmen withheld comment and no action was taken on the proposal.

Knight Tells State Deficit

SACRAMENTO (UP) — Gov. Goodwin J. Knight told a convention of Northern California Republican women Friday the state has been operating on a deficit basis for the past seven years and an eventual tax increase will be necessary to balance the budget.

In a speech prepared for delivery at a noon lunch, Knight said the 1955-57 budget would contain about the same amount of money for building state institutions as was in the current budget. But he said if voters refuse a state construction bond issue on the November ballot, "We shall have to depend almost entirely on increased taxation" to keep pace with the state's need for buildings.

"Despite the bond financing approach, however," Knight said, "I ought to make clear that the state has been operating on a deficit basis for the last seven years, and that eventually it will be necessary to increase state taxes to bring our normal budget into balance. The bond financing program for building construction merely temporizes the immediate tax problem."

French Parties Remain Split

PARIS (UP) — Formation of a new French government looked more remote than ever Friday following refusal of the Catholic MRP (Popular Republican Movement) to support a minority cabinet.

The MRP decision, spelled out by the party's honorary president, Maurice Schuman, and endorsed by its executive committee, was a blow to Pierre Mendes-France's new Republican Front.

The front, an alliance of Mendes-France's Radical Socialist supporters and the Socialists, control some 160 Assembly seats. This falls far short of a majority in the 627-member House, but leaders of the faction are trying to pick up enough extra votes to win a try at forming a cabinet.

The front says it is not seeking the Communists' 151 votes in the new Assembly, but Socialist leader Guy Mollet indicated Red support would not be refused.

House May Get School Debate

WASHINGTON (UP) — President Eisenhower's program of federal aid for school construction may get its first test not in committee hearings but in direct contest on the House floor.

Rep. McConnell (R-Pa.), senior Republican on the House Education Committee, said Friday efforts would be made on the floor to challenge a Democratic-sponsored measure to fit the President's program. There is no present plan, he said, to propose a new House bill.

The Democratic bill, by Rep. Augustine B. Kelley (D-Pa.), has been approved by the Education Committee and is now awaiting Rules Committee clearance. Speaker of the House Rayburn (D-Tex.) said he expects it to reach the House floor "reasonably soon."

FARMER ARRESTED
ITO, Japan (UP) — A 41-year-old farmer was arrested yesterday while trying to break into the resort hotel where Prime Minister Ichiro Hatoyama is vacationing. He told police the air was full of radio waves that were driving him crazy and he wanted the Prime Minister to do something about it.

Jury Trial Set March 5 For John Graham Murder Case

DENVER (UP) — A jury trial is set to start March 5 to determine if John Gilbert Graham was sane last Nov. 1 when he is accused of dynamiting an airliner that buried his mother and 43 others to death.

Trial on the sanity issue was requested by court-appointed defense attorneys who rejected the findings of four psychiatrists that the 23-year-old defendant was sane. In effect, the doctors found Graham knew right from wrong and could refrain from doing wrong.

The defense had its choice of having a separate trial on the sanity issue or including it in a trial to determine Graham's guilt or innocence to charges of murdering his mother Mrs. Daisie E. King, 55.

The sanity trial — expected to last about 40 days — will focus on the testimony of the four psychiatrists, who will report on their examinations of Graham. Details of the bombing of the United Air Lines plane will probably come into this trial only incidentally.

If Graham is found sane, he will then be tried on his plea of innocent to the murder charge. If the jury finds him insane he would be committed to Colorado State Hospital — never to be tried on the murder charge.
