In the January issue of Pacific Northwest Business, Roy J. Sampson, now assistant professor of economics at Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Tex., writes: "The lumber industry is one of the giants of the Pacific Northwest economy. Conditions affect-

ing lumber to some extent affect the prosperity of every business and individual in the region. "Northwesterns, then, can take comfort in an analysis of trends in domestic lumber marketing."
