School Construction Bill Deadlock Reported Broken

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House Rules Committee's deadlock over the school construction bill was reported broken today, and the big debate on federal aid to schools is expected to hit the House floor next week.

"And it will be a hot one," said Rep. McConnell of Pennsylvania, senior Republican on the House Education Committee.

McConnell said "there's no ques-

tion" about the bill coming out of the Rules Committee next Tuesday or Wednesday, though he said floor debate may not begin until the following week.

Other sources said the bill was coming out and debate would start Wednesday.

Pending formal action by the Rules Committee next week, there was no indication how much time would be allowed for debate or what attempts, if any, might be made to restrict amendments.

Former Resident Dies In Eugene

Lester B. Kimble, former resident of Klamath Falls, died this week in Eugene. Mr. Kimble was a resident of Klamath Falls from approximately 1930 to 1945. While a resident here he was employed as an accountant by the Shaw-Bertram Lumber Co. and Pelican Bay Lumber Co.

Mr. Kimble was the first secretary of the Scottish Rite bodies in Klamath Falls and was named to the Knight Commander Court of Honor by that body in 1951.

Services will be held in Eugene at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at the Simon-Launsberry Funeral Home with the Eugene AFAM No. 11 in charge.

TOUR CONTINUED

MADRID, Spain (AP)—Continuing his European tour, President-elect Kubitshchek of Brazil arrived by plane Friday from Rome for a two-day visit to the Spanish capital, Generalissimo Franco.

Spain's chief of state, greeted him at the airport.

But Speaker of the House Rayburn (D-Tex.) has been pushing for action.

The House Education Committee has approved the Democrats' plan to grant \$1,600,000,000 over a four-

year period to states to help them build needed classrooms. Allocations would be based on school age population.

President Eisenhower, in a special message to Congress last week, recommended granting the states 1 1/4 billions over five years and basing allocations on need and ability.

Rep. Kelley (D-Pa.), author of the Democrats' bill, said he's "ready to go" with it.

McConnell said the measure would try to "fit the program, and we're ready to go."

Rep. Powell (D-N.Y.) said he's ready to offer the segregation amendment he has been promising for the last year.

If Republicans and Northern Democrats combine to vote Powell's amendment into the bill, its chances of passage in the Senate are regarded as highly uncertain.

Sen. Hill (D-Aia), head of the Senate committee which would handle the legislation, has said the

amendment would kill the bill in the Senate.

In a Rochester, N.Y., speech last night, Sen. Byrd (D-Va.) announced

Concert Group Plans Drive

The executive board of the Klamath Community Concert Association has set February 27 as the date for the kick-off of the annual membership drive.

Officers made the decision in a meeting Thursday night with Lucille Schreiner, Community Concerts, Inc. representative, New York.

Andrew Loney Jr., president of the local board of directors said that an earlier date will be set at which renewals may be made. Limitations on seating capacity at the Pelican Theater preclude the sale of more than 1507 membership tickets.

Mrs. Schreiner presented a brief outline to the board of artists available for the next concert season. Loney said bookings in Klamath Falls are largely dependent upon artists' availability on Wednesday nights, since that is the only night on which the Pelican Theater, which has the largest seating capacity, is open to the association.

Three more concerts are scheduled on this year's agenda. The Boston "Pops" Tour Orchestra will present a concert on Wednesday, February 15; The Song Masters, a male quartet, on March 21 and Carol Smith, contralto, on April 11. On October 26, members heard Alfred and Herbert Teltchik in a duo-piano concert.

The Boston "Pops" will perform in Klamath Falls under the direction of Harry John Brown, assistant conductor. Soloist is Ruth Slenczynska, pianist.

Attendance at the concerts are by membership ticket only.
