

Rehabilitation Center Set

Allied Rehabilitation, Inc., a non-profit organization, has acquired quarters at 707 South Sixth Street which are now being readied for occupancy in the near future. The project is sponsored by the Devey Powell Chapter No. 12 of the Disabled American Veterans, Klamath Falls, and committee members are Clarence J. Greiger, chairman, Don Johnson and George Kohler.

The Rehabilitation Center will need the help of the community to carry out plans to provide assistance to any needy individuals who require immediate aid. Those who are disabled, sick or in need of lodging and food may apply to the center. Showers are now being installed, and there is an urgent need for bunks and beds, mattresses, bedding, stoves and cooking and eating utensils to furnish the quarters.

The program calls for repair and reconditioning of salvaged articles, providing a means of employment for handicapped and needy persons until they have a chance to adjust. There is space in the building for a retail outlet for resale of the reconditioned items to help provide funds to carry on the project.

C. B. DeMille Proposes Rebirth Of Old Pictures

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—Hollywood usually laughs at its silent pictures, but one great master of the screen, producer-director Cecil B. DeMille, proposes movietown dust off its classics and bring them back to the theaters.

All the younger generation knows of the silents are the misleading satires on TV or in the movies showing hammy characters moving jerkily about.

It took seasoned old-timer DeMille to slap Hollywood's wrist for ignoring its silent classics in his speech when he was given the Screen Producers Guild Milestone Award at a banquet this week.

"The great classics of the screen deserve better treatment," he told the younger producers. "They remain not second rate, but first rate specimens of the motion picture art."

DeMille said the classics should be presented to the public on special projecting machines, running at 60 feet a minute instead of the present 90 that makes great artists jump about like Woody Woodpecker.

"This industry will not come of age until it makes a determined effort to keep its own great classics alive—and to present them regularly to the public in a manner worthy of their merit," DeMille said. "I have wished many times we and the public were more aware of the dramatic riches we have stored in our vaults."

He complained because such films are called "reissues."

"We do not say the next time you go to the Louvre you see a reissue of the Mona Lisa," he explained.

The celebrities burst into applause when DeMille credited the late silent pioneer director D. W. Griffith as being "the teacher of us all."

He also lashed at producers who make films only for money, use "vice" plots or "yield to the ridiculous demands of pressure (censor) groups."
