The elementary school budget committee will start visiting all grade schools in the district, in mid-February, incidental to preparation of the annual budget. Parking on Municipal Street came in for further study by the board during the hours that school buses are in use. Emily Bellin has joined the high school staff, to be in charge of attendance records. Mary Ann Arenas has been employed as head secretary in the high school office. In joint action, the two boards rejected bids of the Klamath Falls Creamery, Medo-Land and Belcastro dairy for furnishing milk to caterers in the city schools. All bids were for the amount of 3 cents per half pint, price being currently paid. Boards will continue to purchase milk under the present open market schedule. Educators from both city systems will attend a tax clinic to be held January 30 in the Erb Memorial Building on the University of Oregon Campus.
