Banana Split

Teen-agers are the hungriest people, but the easiest to feed. Come their turn to entertain, Mom is wise to have ice cream, ice cream and more ice cream on hand.

Popular all year long, ice cream takes on added appeal in the lives of all when it is served with a favorite pour-on, maple-blended syrup. No extra work is involved either for this special pour-on, which is equally good over puddings, cakes and fruits. MAPLE FLAVOR BANANA SPLIT
1 banana, cut in quarters
1 scoop vanilla ice cream
1 scoop chocolate ice cream
1 scoop cherry ice cream
1 cup maple-blended syrup
1-3 cup marshmallow sauce
1 tablespoon chopped pecan meats

1 maraschino cherry
Arrange banana quarters in individual serving dish. Place scoops of ice cream in center. Pour maple-blended syrup over ice cream, then add marshmallow sauce. Sprinkle nuts on top. Garnish with the cherry. Makes 1 serving.

PECAN PIE

Rich desserts are most acceptable in winter time. Log Cabin maple-blended syrup is used in this recipe tested in the General Foods Kitchens.

PECAN PIE
1½ cups maple-blended syrup
Pastry for one-crust pie
1 cup coarsely chopped pecan meats
3 tablespoons butter
¼ cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons flour
3 eggs, well beaten
1½ teaspoon vanilla

Pour syrup into saucepan and boil rapidly, uncovered, 5 to 8 minutes. Let stand about 15 minutes, or while pastry is being made.

Line a 9-inch pie plate with pastry, rolled ¼ inch thick, allowing pastry to extend 1 inch beyond edge. Fold back edge to form standing rim; flute with fingers. Sprinkle nuts in pie shell. Cream together butter, sugar, salt, and flour. Add eggs, syrup, and vanilla; mix well. Pour over nuts in shell. Bake in moderate oven (375 degrees) 40 minutes, or until pie is completely puffed across top. Serve plain or with whipped cream.

The layers are baked from a package of new instant butterscotch cake mix. Whipped cream, orange sections and coconut make the delicious filling and topping. This cake may be made hours in advance and taken from the refrigerator at dessert time.

BUTTERSCOTCH AMBROSIA CAKE

1 package instant butterscotch cake mix
2 eggs, unbeaten
1 cup water
1 cup whipping cream
2-3 cup firmly packed brown sugar
¾ cup cut-up orange sections, well drained (about 2 oranges)
¾ cup tender-thin flaked coconut

Empty cake mix into bowl. Add eggs and water. Beat 3 minutes until smooth and creamy. Pour batter into two round 9-inch layer pans, which have been lined on bottoms with paper. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 25 to 30 minutes. Cool layers.

Combine whipping cream and brown sugar and chill 1 hour. Then whip until thick and shiny. Spread half of the whipped cream

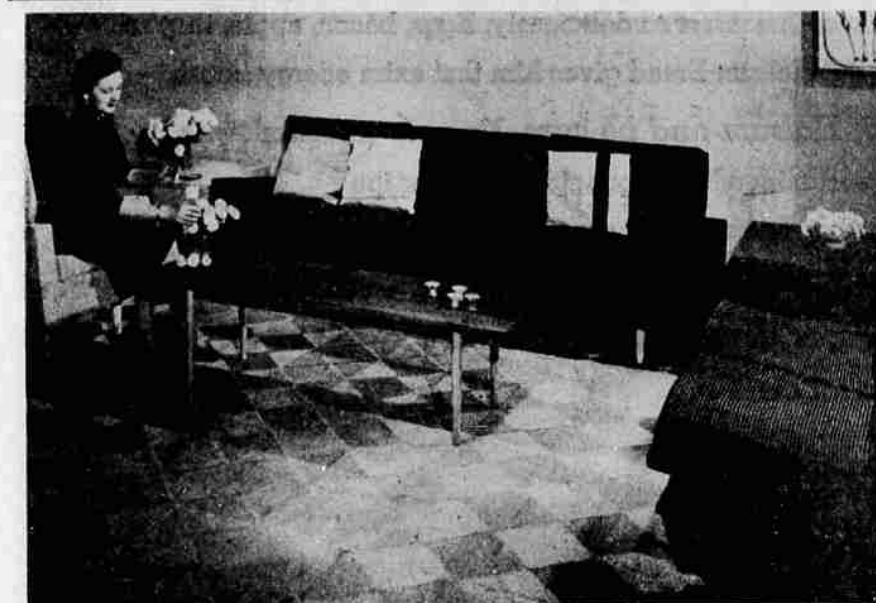
