BEEF ON THE MENU

This week's special beef cookery recipe is one that the Vern Howard family enjoy.

Sweet-Sour Short Ribs
3 pounds short ribs
Salt, pepper, flour, lard
1 cup sliced onions
1 clove garlic
1/2 cups hot water
1 small bay leaf
1/4 cup vinegar
3 tablespoons brown sugar
1-3 cup catsup

Have short ribs cut into individual servings. Remove excess fat. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and dredge with flour. Brown well on all sides in a large skillet with

several tablespoons hot lard or other fat. Remove to a Dutch oven or other large heavy pan. Cook onions and cooked garlic in fat until soft; add to short ribs. Combine remaining ingredients and 1/2 teaspoon salt and pour over ribs. Cover tightly and cook over low heat until tender, two to three hours.

Remove ribs to a serving platter and keep warm. Pour most of the fat from drippings, stir in 2 tablespoons flour and enough water Cook until thickened. Serve short ribs and gravy on hot buttered noodles. This recipe makes four servings.

IMPULSE BUYING

Modern packaging is discovering some interesting psychological information about women shoppers. A recent study made by the Folding Paper Box Association showed that women buy a good many of their personal items of wearing apparel on impulse. To encourage them to obey that impulse, manufacturers are packaging such items as bras in attractive folding cartons and arranging for them to be displayed in different sections of the store along with other impulse buying items, such as cosmetics.

YUMMY DESSERT

On a cold winter night, serve a bowl full of chocolate pudding warm to your family. Prepare the pudding from a package of chocolate pudding and pie filling mix, then, instead of chilling it, serve it within a half hour after taking it off the stove. Pass a pitcher of rich, whole milk around the table to pour over the pudding. It's a good old-fashioned delight.

GRAPE-NUTS PIE

A guest-charmer is this richly textured pie with a divinely special flavor. Combine 2-3 cup sugar, three egg yolks, and two tablespoons cornstarch in top of double boiler. Add two cups milk and blend well. Cook over boiling water until thickened. Remove from heat, add one teaspoon vanilla and one cup Grape-Nuts. Pour into baked 8-inch pie shell. Cool. Spread whipped cream over pie before serving.

PUDDING FUDGE

Combine one package chocolate pudding and pie filling mix, one cup sugar, 1-3 cup milk in saucepan. Stir constantly over low heat until sugar dissolves, then let mixture come to a full boil. Boil two minutes, remove from heat, add two tablespoons butter and beat at once until mixture thickens and loses its gloss. Add 1/2 cup shredded coconut. Turn into 8x4-inch pan, chill, and cut into 36 one-inch squares.

VENETIAN ONION SOUP

1/4 cup butter or margarine
2 cups thinly sliced onions
4 bouillon cubes, crumbled
1 1/2 quarts boiling water
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
3/4 teaspoon salt
4 ounces elbow spaghetti
Grated Parmesan cheese

Melt butter or margarine in large saucepan. Add onions and cook gently, stirring frequently until onions are lightly browned. Add bouillon cubes, water, Worcestershire sauce and salt. Bring to boiling point. Add spaghetti and stir about 1 minute, until bouillon cubes are dissolved. Cover, and simmer gently about 20 minutes. Serve hot with grated Parmesan cheese. Makes 4 large servings.

Here's What GOOD HOUSEKEEPING has to Say About

VACUUM CLEANERS

What to look for -- Which to Buy

(From the February 1956 Good Housekeeping)

Next time you use your vacuum cleaner give it some careful consideration. Is it taking unduly long to do its job? Does it make a racket? Is emptying the bag a messy business? And, most important of all, when the house is finally spick-and-span, are you exhausted? If the answer to any of these questions is "Yes," the chances are you need a new cleaner. New cleaners have a wide variety of desirable new features. Some of these, like new shapes, new colors or new attachments, are easily appraised. But many of the features that will make your new cleaner a joy to use are hidden values—and we believe these are the values that will mean the most to you. Here . . . are pertinent facts and advice.

WHAT'S NEW?

Don't make the mistake of thinking that vacuum cleaners have been "dressed up" while remaining basically the same in operation. One most significant improvement is the use of disposable paper bags or easy-to-empty containers. This releases you from all the messy aspects of getting rid of vacuum-cleaner dirt. Way out in front too are functional designs of cleaners today—they are lighter in weight, more maneuverable, easier to store, and certainly quieter. Wands stay together in use but come apart easily when you want them to.

CLEANING PERFORMANCE

There's a big difference in the way vacuum cleaners clean. Good tank or canister cleaners, for example, have enough suction to do a good all-around job of cleaning . . . Salesmen often use the amount of suction a cleaner has as proof of power. For more important than suction are the over-all design of the cleaner and its suitability for the job it has to do in your home. Tank and canister cleaners excel in above-the-floor cleaning . . . On hard surfaces (wood, linoleum, etc.), they are every bit as efficient as the upright and are easier to handle. The chart . . . (below) . . . will help you weigh all points of difference between the upright and the tank or canister . . .

How to pick the Right Vacuum Cleaner

A study of the chart below will steer you to the right type of vacuum cleaner for your needs. If you decide two cleaners would be ideal, consider keeping your old one, if it still performs some jobs well, and buy a new one of the other type.

	UPRIGHT	TANK OR CANISTER
Cleaning Heavy Carpets	Dirt removal excellent. Cleans with comparative ease.	Dirt removal good, but requires more strokes and, therefore, more effort.
Cleaning Fiber or Loop Rugs	May not "travel" smoothly. Otherwise, satisfactory.	Excellent for throw rugs, or fiber or looped (shaggy) rugs.
Cleaning Bare Floors	Fair in efficiency and convenience.	Excellent if floor brush is used.
Cleaning Under Low Furniture	Generally not possible without moving furniture.	Will clean under most low furniture.
Ease of Emptying	Large-capacity disposal bag available on most. Others must be shaken out.	Easiest with disposable bag. Others as easy to empty as a wastebasket.
Ease of Storage	Requires some convenient storage place; this is suitable for type of cleaner and for attachments. Be sure to keep cleaner accessible for quick daily, as well as weekly, cleaning.	Needn't be carried from room to room if mounted on wheels or runners.
Noise Level	Varies. Generally noisier than tank or canister.	Varies. Some brands are specially insulated to reduce noise.
Portability	Wheels from room to room.	

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
