Anderson Case Filing Delayed

The state was granted an additional 30 days Thursday to file its brief in the James Quinton Anderson murder case which is on appeal to the Oregon Supreme Court.

Defense Attorneys Herbert and Robert Welch of Lakeview, filed notice of appeal. They claimed Anderson did not have a fair trial because Special Prosecutor Charles Raymond, Portland, and former Klamath County District Attorney Frank Alderson, were not deputed in Harney County.

Attorney Welch said Thursday morning that he would oppose any further delays by the state in filing a brief. He added: "Mr. Raymond, who was employed by Klamath County to handle the case, asked for this latest postponement because he was involved in other criminal cases in Portland and did not have time to prepare his brief."
