Magistrate Hears Cases

WEED — A fist fight last Monday evening about 8 o'clock ended when police were called to Inlet Street and booked Gregorio Torres, 33, Weed, and Augustin Rodriguez, 26, Grass Lake, on charges of drunkenness and disturbing the peace. Torres, who appeared before Judge Kenneth Stone January 30 in Judicial Court, pleaded guilty to the two charges and was fined \$50. Rodriguez was scheduled to appear in court later.

Peity theft charges were heard against Billy Lanning, 25, Weed, January 31, and after pleading guilty to the charge he was sentenced by Judge Kenneth Stone to serve 15 days in the Weed jail, serving on weekend periods. Lanning was arrested January 24 on a warrant issued on the complaint of Frank Lucero who reported the loss of a strong box containing approximately \$15 cash, and a valuable ring, as well as a 22 high standard pistol taken from his apartment. Officers located the pistol before making the arrest, but the box and its contents have not been returned to date.

Michael Patch, 43, Seattle, will serve five days in the county jail at Yreka after pleading guilty to a vagrancy charge when he appeared before Judge Kenneth Stone January 31 following his arrest on Highway 99 between Weed and Gazelle that day by a deputy sheriff.

WEED — Another runaway juvenile was apprehended in Weed this week when Police Chief Harold Barnum stopped an auto driven by the youthful driver for a routine check.

Interrogation resulted with the 15-year-old boy from Cornelius, Oregon admitting he was driving his father's car in an attempted run-away.
