HORSES IN WILL

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP)—Heirs of Mrs. E. Mary Stevenson stand to gain because this city has no mistreated horses on its streets. Her 1953 will left much of her estate for care of such horses. But Circuit Judge Joseph Bradley ruled yesterday that since no such condition exists, the entire estate should go to heirs.

Early Telephone Calls For Income Tax Reports Urged

Use of telephones to secure information regarding income tax returns is increasing. The majority of the calls are being made between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. each day, and although additional trunk lines have been installed, some taxpayers are getting the busy signal at tax offices.

"Busy taxpayers will find their calls promptly handled, if they call before 10 or after 3, any day of the week," stated Ralph C. Grandquist, district director of the Oregon District.

On February 3 last year, 63,000 returns had been filed for this district. As of the same date this year, only 44,700 Forms 1040 and 1040A have been filed. By greater use of telephone service available many individuals will be able to

file their returns immediately. In those cases where a refund is due, the early filer generally gets his refund at an earlier date.

A trained and augmented staff of employees is available at the larger district offices to take care of counter service, principally on Mondays, but to the extent necessary on other workdays of the week," the District Director stated, adding, "In addition, monitors are stationed in these larger offices to answer questions and assist each taxpayer who has problems in preparing his return."

In most field locations where only a small staff is maintained, assistance is available on Mondays. Employees in the field remain in their office all day on Mondays principally for such taxpayer assistance work. Taxpayers in these areas can telephone daily, or if necessary visit the office, if problems are complex.

A considerable number of income tax returns filed to date jointly by husband and wife are being received with only the signature of the husband. Both husband and wife should sign the Form 1040 if a joint return is being filed, even though the wife may have no income or deductions.

Intelligent questions asked by taxpayers in making telephone calls to the office, a spokesman stated, indicate very definitely that taxpayers are finding out they are able to prepare their own returns this year with very little difficulty, after having read carefully the new printed instructions accompanying their Form 1040.

New Telephone Official Named

Child Clinic Eyes Budget

An annual operating budget of \$7,500 for the fiscal year beginning June 30, 1956 and ending on June 30, 1957, to cover expenses at the local level for the Klamath County Child Guidance Clinic, was adopted at a noon meeting February 14.

The meeting, held in the Klamath County Public Health office was chaired by Ben Kerns.

The budget request which will be presented to the Klamath County Court for final approval, includes an added item of \$1,500 this year for the first time to provide for the services of a psychiatrist on a part time basis, who may be interested in locating in Southern Oregon.

Last year's budget derived from state, county, city school and county school sources was in the amount of \$6,000. State funds accounted for \$2,500, county funds, \$1,200, city schools, \$1,600 and county schools, \$600.

In the 1956-1957 budget, \$5,500 is earmarked for the salary of Daniel F. Campbell, full-time psychiatric social worker, located in Klamath Falls; \$500 for traveling expenses and the remaining \$1,000, allowed for the services of a psychiatrist if available.

Past domestic services in the amount of \$7,100 from state and county sources have included the part time services of Dr. John Waterman, psychiatrist with the Oregon State Department of Health and Mrs. Waterman, social worker since the clinic was organized. Growing interest of other states in the work being accomplished in Oregon in the field of clinical assistance to emotionally maladjusted individuals is being indicated. It was announced by Campbell who gave a report on clinic activities during the past few months.

Mental Health Week will be observed April 29-May 5.

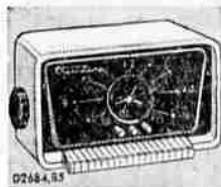
All except Loney drive on the average more than 100,000 miles per year. Loney averages about 40,000 miles.
