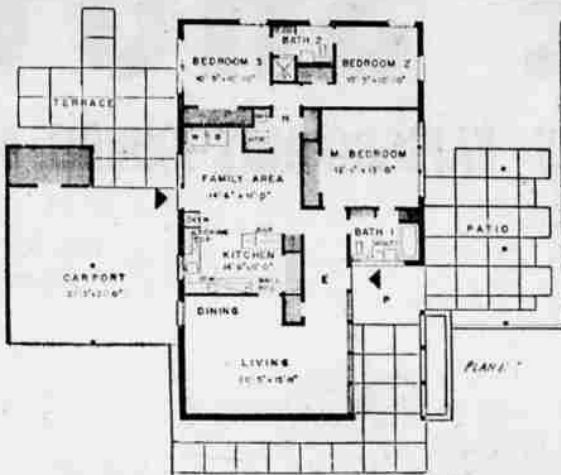

SOUTHWEST TEMPO—A smartly designed house for modern living. Compactly designed for year-round air conditioning, this plan features an open family recreation room and kitchen in the heart of the house. In addition, a large living room, three bedrooms and two bathrooms are arranged for excellent circulation. A broad white roof with wide over-hanging eaves stretches from a fenced-in patio on one side over carport on the other side. This is plan H-4-AP by Charles E. Armstrong, 1013 University Dr., Fort Worth, Texas. The house covers 1,485 square feet. Carport adds 519 square feet and porch, patio and terrace 636 square feet.



New Schools' Needs Told

School buildings that are expandable and flexible are highly important in our changing communities where population grows and declines every quarter of a century.

Architect Alonzo J. Harriman of Auburn, Maine points out the practical way to meet these ever-changing classroom needs:

"How many of you have schools that are not 50 years old, but less," says Architect Harriman, "that you would like to remodel, but cannot, due to the excessive cost of altering masonry buildings?"

Architect Harriman, like most of his colleagues across the country, has found the answer to economical, beautiful schools that are efficient for they can be changed to meet the demands of each generation of students.

The one story lumber-framed school, with ample glass in the walls economically and safely set in wood sash, offers easy, low-cost future expansion.

Much of the lumber being used in these honest, functional and friendly buildings is Douglas fir, western red cedar and west coast hemlock.

Here, the photographs are simply matted and set in brackets of clear plastic that secure the glass to the matted photographs. 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Teachers Plan OSC Meeting

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — Oregon State College will be host to more than 300 college and high school science teachers at three training institutes and a meeting of the National Science Teachers Association during this year's summer session.

Biggest of the three institutes will be a teacher-training program for some 50 college chemistry teachers to be held July 9 to August 3.

It will be financed by a \$21,600 fund from the National Science Foundation. OSC was one of 20 colleges and universities that received more than half a million dollars from the foundation for teacher-training in science. Staff for the institute will be chosen from among the country's top educators, according to W. H. Staubaugh, associate professor of chemistry at OSC and co-chairman of the session.

During the same four-week period, the Northwest regional institute for science teachers will hold a similar training session for about 25 teachers from the nation's high schools. Another 32 selected high school teachers from seven Western states have been invited to the West Coast conference for science teachers scheduled June 17 to June 30.

The National Science Teachers Association will hold its annual summer meeting June 30 to July 3. Stanley E. Williamson, head of science education at OSC, said that from 200 to 300 teachers from all over the United States are expected to attend.

The three teacher-training programs are all devoted to improving science teaching in high schools and colleges by bringing together knowledge of recent advances in the field and through contact with leading educators.



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
