SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Rain havoc with two out-of-season holidays yesterday as San Francisco ended its welcome to Chinese New Year and Yuba City opened a week-long "Christmas in February" celebration. Only 1000 persons attended church services in the large white tent set up downtown to serve as the center of the week-long holiday. The "Christmas in February" observance will be climaxed Saturday, Feb. 25, when Santa Claus will distribute to the area's 15,000 children presents donated by many civil groups, military camps and individuals. Meanwhile, in San Francisco the Golden Dragon, Chinatown's main attraction of the New Year's parade, stayed in-doors because of driving rain. Floods In Kentucky On Wane

BARBOURVILLE, Ky. — Dangers of major floods by many streams diminished in Kentucky today almost as suddenly as heavy rains stirred them up Friday night. The receding Cumberland River left substantial damage in Barbourville. The Cumberland crested two feet over forecasts yesterday and started falling again within two hours. Its waters moved into some 40 homes and routed approximately 100 families in threatened areas. The crest was about eight feet over flood stage and left water up to 10 feet deep in lower areas. Barbourville was isolated for several hours when two feet of water covered U.S. 25-E on both sides of town. Damage was even less upstream at Pineville and other points and lower crests were seen in down-river points in Kentucky and Tennessee.

Alcoholism Study Slated

In an effort to learn more about the problem of alcoholism among Indians, and how to deal with it more effectively, Commissioner of Indian Affairs Glenn L. Emmons today announced the appointment of a special three-man commission which will begin in the near future a three-month study on the Navajo Reservation of Arizona, New Mexico and Utah and other Indian reservations of New Mexico and Colorado.

Appointed to the commission were O. K. Armstrong, Springfield, Missouri, former member of Congress; Ernest A. Shepherd, Avon Park, Florida, administrator of the Florida State Alcoholic Rehabilitation Program; and Rev. David A. Works, North Conway, New Hampshire. Miss Helene Gifford, assistant commissioner (community services) of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, will serve as an ex-officio member.

In announcing formation of the commission, Commissioner Emmons pointed out that most Indian reservations have not up to now had the benefit of facilities and services for dealing with alcoholism which are available in many non-Indian communities throughout the country. The underlying purpose of the commission's study will be to take the first steps toward an eventual filling of this gap. If the results warrant, similar studies may be undertaken later in other Indian areas.

Initiation of the new study, Commissioner Emmons emphasized, does not mean that the bureau advocates any change in existing Federal law governing sale of alcoholic beverages to Indians. The present law, he added, was enacted in 1953 to eliminate old statutory provisions which discriminated against the Indians solely on the grounds of race.

While the commission's study will be conducted under general supervision of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the United States Public Health Service, which has been responsible for health work among the Indians since last July, will take part by providing technical assistance and cooperation.
