### Billion Asked For Air Force

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Russell (D-Ga.) Wednesday urged an increase "of not less than" 1 1/2 billion dollars in new Air Force funds to meet the increasing air-atomic powers of Soviet Russia.

"Frankly, I would like to go somewhat higher than that," Russell said in an interview. He is chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee.

The Georgia Democrat said he favors stepping up production of the B52, an intercontinental jet bomber which he called "the best deterrent to possible war." He also suggested an increase in funds to speed development of guided and ballistic missiles.

For hours Tuesday, Russell and other committee members questioned Secretary of the Air Force Quarles and Gen. Nathan F. Twining, Air Force chief of staff, behind closed doors.

Quarles and Twining described as "austere" President Eisenhower's budget request for 16 1/2 billion dollars in new Air Force funds.

But they said it would be adequate.

Twining said he conditioned his support of Eisenhower's Air Force budget on an understanding it will be increased next year.

A screened version of their testimony was given to newsmen.

### Graham Shies From TV Show

DENVER, Colo. (UP) — John Gilbert Graham, who vowed a few hours earlier to prove on the witness stand that he did not murder his mother and 43 other persons on a bombed airliner, suddenly shied from a television interview last night.

News director Tom Carlisle of station KFTV had planned an interview on his regular newscast at 10 p.m. (MST) with Graham and set up TV cameras in the county jail.

But when the cameras focused on Graham's cell, he refused to say a word and tried to avoid them. All the cameras picked up were fleeting, sullen glances. Carlisle devoted most of the program to an interview with Warden Gordon Dolliver.

Earlier in the day, the Denver Post published a series of photographs of Graham, which showed him smiling and confident as he was interviewed by Post reporter Zeke Schier.

Schier quoted Graham as stating: "I will take the witness stand and prove to the jury that I am innocent."

The 24-year-old well-built restaurant operator is accused of planting a dynamite bomb in the luggage of his mother, Mrs. Daisy King, before she boarded a United Air Lines DC6B the night of last November 1, in a plot to collect trip insurance. The plane was blown out of the sky near Longmont, Colorado, 30 miles north of Denver, and all 44 persons aboard died.
