 Fifty bison have been born in the past 15 years and 20 more calves are ready for delivery soon.
 The herd has become a hazard and a nuisance and bills are running high.
 He has considered every solution. Meat packers, zoos, conservation commissions won't buy them. The State of Wisconsin doesn't like his proposal of simply turning them loose. He has ruled out slaughtering them.

Oregon Flood Money Asked

THOMASVILLE, Ga. (AP)—President Eisenhower Tuesday asked Congress for supplemental appropriations to finance flood control projects in California and Oregon.
 James C. Hagerly, White House press secretary, said at Eisenhower's vacation headquarters here the requests will not increase the federal spending budget for the fiscal year starting July 1.
 The reason, he said, is that the increase requests are being accompanied by decreased suggestions in other fields. The overall result, Hagerly added, is a net decrease of \$93,000 in the total budget.
 Eisenhower asked for \$400,000 for a general appraisal by the army engineers of need for flood control projects in the Far Western states. He also requested that \$3,900,000 be transferred from other budget categories for a start on three flood control projects in California—the Success and Terminus Reservoirs in the Central Valley area, and the American River levees in the Sacramento region.
 Of that total, \$50,000 would be used to speed up work on the Johnson Creek flood control project near Portland, Ore.
