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COTTON

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REFRESHMENTS

Hot chocolate and cookies provide cold weather refreshments for the small fry. Keep plenty of home-made cookies on hand, and then, of course, hot chocolate can be prepared in a jiffy. And you can keep the youngsters happy with nourishing snacks.

This Spice Cookie recipe is enriched with nutritious—Instant Starlac, the heart of milk. This instant nonfat dry milk contains important nutrients of milk — protein, calcium and riboflavin and yet is so inexpensive. The family-size package makes 12 quarts (three gallons) of nonfat milk for only about seven cents a quart. Instant nonfat dry milk mixes immediately even in ice water, and it is used for drinking, cooking and baking.

Here are recipes for Quickie Hot Chocolate and Spice Cookies:
QUICKIE HOT CHOCOLATE (Makes one serving)
1 tablespoon cocoa
2 tablespoons instant Starlac nonfat dry milk powder
3 teaspoons sugar
2-3 cup boiling water
Mix together the cocoa, instant Starlac, sugar and dry powder and sugar in a cup. Pour boiling water

over the mixture. Stir well with a spoon. Serve immediately. A drop of vanilla may be added, if desired.
SPICE COOKIES
2 1/2 cups sifted flour
3/4 cup instant Starlac nonfat dry milk powder
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon ginger
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 cup shortening
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/2 cup unsifted molasses
Sift together flour, instant Starlac nonfat dry milk powder, baking soda, salt and spices. Cream shortening until light and fluffy. Gradually add sugar; beat until well blended. Beat in egg and molasses. Add dry ingredients; blend well.

Wrap in waxed paper. Chill at least 1/2 hour. Roll dough on lightly floured board up to 1/4 inch thickness; cut cookies in desired shapes. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (375 degrees) 8 to 10 minutes or until edges begin to brown and center of cookie is firm. Remove from cookie sheet; cool.

NEAT TRICKS
Before scalding milk, wipe the bottom of the pan with a piece of butter of margarine to prevent scorching. Low heat will take a little longer, but there is less danger of the milk boiling.
