

Prospector Shows Up

HANKSVILLE, Utah (UP) — A California uranium prospector missing since Tuesday hiked 80 miles into a remote southern Utah Civil Aeronautics Administration station last night and reported both he and the helicopter he had been flying were all right.

Ben Williams, a 38-year-old father of five from Sacramento, Calif., walked into Hanksville, The community is so remote its only direct link with the outside world is by high frequency radio to another CAA station at Bryce Canyon, 90 miles away.

Williams disappeared on a flight from Kanab, on the Arizona border, to Escalante, Civil Air Patrol planes spent Tuesday afternoon and all of today in an unsuccessful attempt to spot the helicopter.

Williams said he made an emergency landing when he ran out of fuel, but the craft was undamaged and probably could be flown safely back to his owner, Willard Hauser of Escalante.

NEW YORK (P)—As in no previous election year, television and radio are going all out to achieve a complete and varied coverage of political news.

Cosmic Rays Blast Earth

CHICAGO (UP) — Scientists rushed today to measure the effects of a huge fiery blast on the sun and the greatest cosmic ray bombardment of the earth in recorded history.

Balloons carrying research apparatus climbed 22 miles into the stratosphere to record the mysterious cosmic artillery. Scientific reports were also awaited from areas as remote as Admiral Richard Byrd's expedition near the South Pole.

Physicists at the University of Chicago, who first announced the solar bombardment, said there was no danger to human beings. However, interference with television and radio reception and deadening of the trans-Atlantic telephone is possible, they said.

The cosmic ray bombardment started Wednesday, 90 minutes after a mammoth blast of fiery gases on the sun, possibly equal to the force of a million hydrogen bombs.

The giant flare on the sun was the fifth of its kind on record and the cosmic bombardment was the greatest since scientists began studying the mysterious rays.

Scientists at Chicago said cosmic rays were hitting the earth and zipping through everything at the rate of 3000 a minute—15 times the usual rate. An even greater intensity was recorded at Climax, Colo.

The bombardment continued early today, but at a diminishing rate, scientists said.

Anita Ekberg Getting Used To 'Ekberg Iceberg' Label

Now she holds contracts for pictures with five different companies. The long-legged beauty lived in a \$75-a-month apartment here, but now she's looking for a swanky place. Stardom has brought other changes—The wolves are more "nice."

Missing Tug Reported Seen

SUVA, Fiji Islands (UP) — A New Zealand Air Force search plane today reported sighting a tug missing, since Sunday with six men aboard.

The 60-foot Shell Co. Tug No. 40 was battling heavy seas in the storm lashed Pacific but apparently is in no danger, the search plane reported.

The tug left Suva Sunday to salvage a yacht stranded on a reef some 200 miles away, usually a two-day voyage. However, it failed to reach its destination and a sea and air search was begun.

Early today, the search plane spotted the tug some 200 miles northeast of its original destination. The pilot reported the plane checked the tug's compass by radio and provided her the course to steer.

Kefauver Raps Foreign Policy

ROCKY MOUNT, N.C. (P)—Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) criticized Secretary of State Dulles last night for making "many mistakes" in the conduct of American foreign policy.

At a news conference after his address at a Junior Chamber of Commerce banquet, he told newsmen he is in a much stronger position in his quest for the nomination now than he was at this stage four years ago. In 1952 he lost to Adlai Stevenson, an opponent again this year.

Kefauver said he has received expressions of "a lot of support" among North Carolina political leaders. He said, "I hope to get some delegates from North Carolina" at the Democratic National Convention in August.

On the subject of foreign policy, he said Dulles "many mistakes" and the slogans with which he has been associated have lost many friends for America.

"The present administration has not had a foreign policy," he said. "It is just going from one crisis to another."

"Neither Congress nor the people are adequately informed on foreign policy. They (the administrations) are setting in secrecy. The people, I think, are substantial enough to take bad news without being badly disturbed."
