LAKEVIEW — Lake County will have three representatives at the delegate assembly of the Oregon Educational Association which meets at Portland on March 2-3.

Mrs. Anne Sprague will represent the County School Superintendents Association's Area 3, which includes 20 counties in eastern and southern Oregon. H. B. Ferrin, who serves on the OEO board of trustees for Klamath, Josephine, Jackson and Lake counties in district 6, will attend the assembly meeting as will Robert Brown, representing the Lake County unit of OEA.

The scholarships will be known as the General Carl A. Spaatz, General Lucas V. Beau and Colonel D. Harold Byrd scholarships.

Candidates for the scholarships must be of good moral character and have graduated, or due to graduate, during current academic year from a secondary school. Certain specific high school courses must have been completed to qualify.

A CAP certificate of proficiency must be held by all candidates and the cadet must be an outstanding member of the CAP. All applicants must pass the college entrance examination board test. All members of the CAP who can qualify are eligible to compete for the scholarships.
