President's Early Indecision Similar To First Days Of '52

WASHINGTON (AP)—At first, he said no—positively. Then he began sounding a little like a possible candidate. Finally, at Paris Jan. 7, 1952, came the announcement millions had been waiting for.

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower announced he was a Republican and said that if the party nominated him for the presidency he would regard it as his duty to accept.

"It would be idle to pretend," he said, reading carefully from a prepared statement, "that my health can be wholly restored to the excellent state in which the doctors believed it to be in mid-September. My future life must be carefully regulated to avoid fatigue."

STAND CONTINUED
He continued to take this stand through 1948, when moves to draft him got under way in both the Republican and Democratic parties.

TIPOFF?
Was this a tipoff? A plesantry? The latter, said Eisenhower—he'd only been kidding.

SOME METHOD
"I could devoutly wish," he said, "that there were some method by which the American people could point out the path of my true duty." But the question, he said, was one that had to be decided by himself alone.

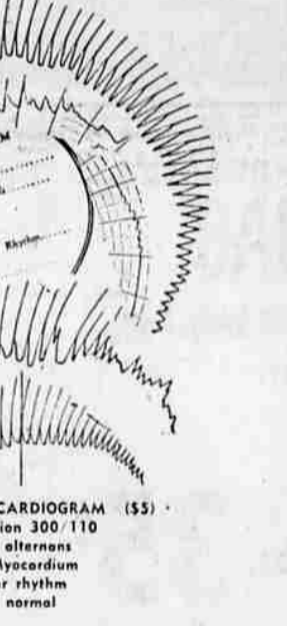
New Mail Service Planned By PO
