MOVING HINTS

Millions of American families are now on the move. Settling into a new house or apartment can be an exciting adventure in living, a second chance to make your dream house come true.

To get the best out of the move, it's important to systematize the preliminary chores and do them as easily as possible, says Madge Lewyt, director of the Home Service Bureau of a leading vacuum cleaner manufacturer. Here are simple, practical suggestions the bureau has worked out to help you.

The basic rule, the experts say, is to have both the new house and all the furnishings you move into it in hand-box order. There's no sense in moving dirt from the old quarters into the new, or having left-over tasks to spoil the fun of arranging and beautifying your new home.

Once you have the spic-and-span principle clearly in mind, outline an easy routine to follow, the Lewyt home-management experts advise. Consult your moving company at once and settle on a date. Otherwise, they may not be able to do the job at the most desirable time.

The next step is to clear out the things you are going to throw or give away. Get rid of them before you do anything else—be sure to toss out the presses you've had so much. Now you're ready to start packing. But before you start your packing, roll out the vacuum cleaner—it's a willing slave to help you.

Books come first, because you can spare them for a while. The dusting brush attachment of your vacuum cleaner will get them clean as a whistle in almost no time at all. Then stand them upright in small cartons. Treat records and record albums the same way. Then cover the exposed edges of books and records with newspaper, and tape or tie it in place.

You should also take care of the draperies in the first days, according to the Lewyt experts, who advise using the same dusting brush to clean them at the top where they are gathered or pinch-pleated. Then change to the upholstery tool, and, spreading the folds with one hand, run the tool back and forth over the length and breadth of the fabric with the other hand.

Carpets, rugs and upholstered furniture should also be thoroughly vacuum-cleaned. And if you have the slightest suspicion of moth eggs, the Lewyt Bureau stresses the importance of de-mothing immediately. Follow the manufacturers' instructions for using paradichlorobenzene crystals.

It is important also to make sure that all clothing is free from moths. Anything that needs to be dry-cleaned should be sent to the cleaner with instructions to "hold" until it can be delivered to the new address. Examine all wool clothing to make sure there are no moths. If you find any, vacuum-clean the garments and de-moth, following directions as before.

Pour milk into mixing bowl. Add pudding mix and beat slowly with egg beater just until well mixed, about 1 minute. Do not overbeat; mixture will be thin. Quickly fold in nuts, cherries and pineapple. Pour at once into serving dishes and let stand to set—takes 5 minutes. Makes 4 servings.

CLEAN-UP MITTENS Here's an idea for knitting enthusiasts. Use up scraps of colorful yarn by knitting a handy duster mitten. Follow any pattern you like, make it generous in size. Then pull three inch strands of yarn through the palm and tie them on the right side like a shag rug. The mitten is fine for cleaning hard-to-get-at nooks and crannies—dry for dusting, or laden with thick suds for washing. Light colored yarns are best for the shaggy working surface so soil will show up to warn you when the mitten needs to be laundered.
