Amber has achieved quite a record so far this year by placing third out of 36 females in the winners' group at the Golden Gate Show held in San Francisco on January 21-22. Amber was judged winners' bitch and best opposite sex at Roseburg at the February 12 show. She was 10 months old on February 16.

Mrs. McDonald has been handling dogs since 1946 and has handled 16 breeds in addition to her own collies in bench shows.

The meeting was called to order by the president, Claudia Malcolm. The secretary read the minutes of the last meeting and called the



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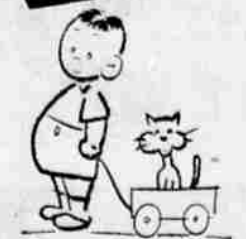
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
