

### First Of Police School Series Begins Thursday

Klamath Falls will be one of the 14 cities in Oregon where classes will be held in a series of regional in-service police training schools, Orville Hamilton, Klamath Falls chief of police, announced today.

The first in the series of seven classes will be held next Thursday.

The course is being sponsored by the Oregon Association of City Police Officers and the Oregon State Sheriffs Association, and is being carried out in cooperation with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Oregon State Police, the League of Oregon Cities, and the University of Oregon.

Classes will be held here in the city hall beginning at 1:30 p.m. each day, Hamilton said.

The first class, planned for Thursday, is titled Public Relations: The Constitution of the United States and the Local Law Enforcement Officer. It will be conducted by Julius Rice and Alvin L. Barton, special agents of the FBI.

Other classes are:

March 13, Burglary Investigation and Suppression Techniques, John F. Nolan, detective sergeant of the Portland Police Department.

March 15, Functions of the State Board of Parole and Probation, Hal

Randall of Salem, director, State Board of Parole and Probation.

March 20, Basic Fingerprinting, John T. Truett, Bend police chief.

Max E. Taylor, FBI special agent, Stanley McDonald of the Multnomah County Sheriff's office, Sheriff Rupert Gilmore of Hood River County and Oakley V. Glenn, identification superintendent of Eugene.

March 22, Uniform Report Writing and Use of Notebooks; Informational Resources of State Agencies, Oregon State Police Lt. Paul Morgan, Farley Mogan and Lyle Harrell.

March 27, Traffic Accident Investigation, Vern Hill, Eugene police chief.

March 29, Interrogations, Confessions and Signed Statements, instructor to be furnished by Portland Bureau of Police.

### Arabia Wants Jet Planes

WASHINGTON (AP)—Saudi Arabia was disclosed today to have asked to buy a small number of jet planes from the United States in addition to 18 more tanks.

Officials who reported this said the request has not received U.S. approval. They indicated it would get the same "most careful scrutiny" promised for all Middle East arms requests in a Feb. 18 State Department announcement lifting a two-day embargo on such shipments.

The embargo was imposed amid controversy over a previous shipment of light tanks.

The Saudi request for an undisclosed number of jet planes and 18 M47 Patton medium tanks, officials said, is in addition to seven million dollars worth of U.S. military goods authorized for shipment to Saudi Arabia in the past six months.

This represents almost half the 16 million in arms shipments to the Middle East for which export licenses were granted since August. Of the rest, six million went to other Arab countries and three million to Israel, it was understood.

Israel's big request for 63 million in defensive weapons is still "under consideration." This figure was revised upward from 50 million as a result of changes made in the arms list first submitted Nov. 16 by Israeli Ambassador Abba Eban.

### George Montgomery Comes Out As Dramatic Actor

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—George Montgomery—famed as a furniture maker, husband of Dinah Shore, western movie actor and social chameleon around town—at last is blossoming out to be what he wants: A dramatic actor.

George has been a prominent social figure in the movie colony. His hand-made furniture decorates the homes of such stars as Van Johnson, Jack Webb, William Holden and Joel McCrea. Furniture manufacturers beg him to enlarge his small furniture business; he turns down a fortune in orders.

He and Dinah are top tennis players at the swanky Racquet Club in Palm Springs. They entertain the biggest names in town. But frustrated George, like others bitten with the show business bug, just wants to be an actor.

"At parties Sam Goldwyn keeps saying, 'I must put you in a picture some day.' Mervyn LeRoy says he'll find something for me," related George.

"But at last I have done a dramatic role that I hope will mark a new trend in my career—after 40 pictures and 20 westerns."

The film is "Huk," made entirely in the Philippines, co-starring Mona Freeman. Already Montgomery has been honored with two other dramatic scripts, and he hopes he's headed for a big-time comeback.

"I was under contract to 20th Century-Fox before the war," he said. "I got the top fan mail on the lot and was up for top productions. 'Then came the war,' he added. 'When I came back nothing was out of me from Montana and could ride a horse—so I did westerns. But I'm not satisfied with doing these things.'

The handsome Montgomery is determined to drive for a living fame, but curiously he could step into other creative businesses if he chose. He started making benches for his home nine years ago. When Alan Ladd and other friends swamped him with orders, he started a shop.
