CHICAGO — Grain worked their way higher as the recent fast trading pace slackened on the Board of Trade Friday.  
Lack of deliveries of cash grain on March contracts proved a firming factor in rye and old crop wheat. New crop wheat rebounded from recent weakness on the prospect of little, if any, moisture in the winter wheat belt over the next five days.  
Wheat closed 1 1/4% higher, March 2.20 1/2; corn 1 1/4% higher, March 1.20 1/2; oats 1/4% higher, March 60 1/2; soybeans 1 1/4% higher, March 1.31 1/2; soybeans 1 1/4% lower to 2 1/4% higher, March 2.20 1/2 and land 12 to 13 cents a hundred pounds higher, March 12.07.

Steer and heifers were quoted nominally steady. Top price in the market was \$16.00, paid for a package of good to choice mixed yearlings. Cows were active and strong at \$10.25 to \$12.50 for utility and commercial and \$9.00 to \$11.00 for canners and cutters.

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Wounded Boy Said Improved

Gary Lee Hankins, 10-year-old boy seriously injured by a .22 caliber bullet Monday, shows slight improvement following surgery performed Tuesday afternoon at the Sacred Heart Hospital in Medford. By Thursday afternoon he could move the fingers of his right hand, had recovered some use of his respiratory system and possibly had some feeling coming back to his toes.  
Son of Mr. and Mrs. Orrin H. Hankins of Dalry, Gary and his three brothers were playing Monday afternoon in the attic of the Hankins home with a .22 caliber rifle when the gun in the hands of 14-year-old Dennis Orrin Hankins discharged. The bullet entered Gary's chest and clipped his spinal column, causing paralysis, but did not sever the nerve. He was brought to the Klamath Valley Hospital about 6:40 p.m. Loss of blood necessitated blood transfusions before the boy could again be moved.  
Mercy Flights, Inc., air ambulance took the injured boy to Medford Tuesday morning, accompanied by his mother, and surgery was performed soon after his arrival at the Sacred Heart Hospital. He is on a rotating bed, with special nurses 24-hours a day. Attendants report that he will require at least five months hospitalization and hopes for complete recovery are favorable.

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Klamath Falls police are expanding their search for Alvin Decker, 10-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. William C. Decker, 2624 Vandergriff, who has been missing since Thursday morning.  
Police said the boy's disappearance was discovered by his mother at about 7 a.m. when she found his bed was empty and he was not in the house. She said he was probably wearing a green jacket with a fur collar.  
The boy is described as being four feet 11 inches tall and weighing 70 pounds. He has blue eyes, blond hair and a light complexion.

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
