

Jordan Army Designer Fired

LONDON (UP)—The British Foreign Office said today that King Hussein of Jordan had fired Gen. John Glubb Pasha, a man who had devoted his life to making Jordan's Arab Legion one of the crack fighting forces in the Middle East.

A Foreign Office spokesman said he had no other information but Jerusalem Radio said Glubb and another British officer already had left by plane for London, and that Jordan's Brig. Gen. Radi "Ummah" had succeeded Glubb.

King Hussein's action was a blow to British prestige in the sun-baked Middle East and a victory for the Arab states of Egypt, Syria and Saudi Arabia which teamed together and offered to match Britain's annual grant of \$22,000,000 a year to the legion.

It was the blow to the western Allies as well for Jordan has been under western pressure to join the anti-Communist Baghdad Pact. Opposition in Jordan to the pact erupted in wild rioting late last year when scores of persons were injured and three governments fell.

The white-haired Glubb, 59, had served with the famous Arab Legion for more than 30 years. And his well-trained and disciplined efficiency was widely credited for preventing the nation-wide riots from turning into a major internal disaster.

The effect of Glubb's dismissal on Britain's position in Jordan was not known immediately. Britain has maintained a base in Jordan within easy marching distance of the Suez Canal from which its forces already are withdrawing.

Easter Seal Leader Named

Mrs. Snell has been closely identified with the work of the society since its inception and is a former member of the executive board.

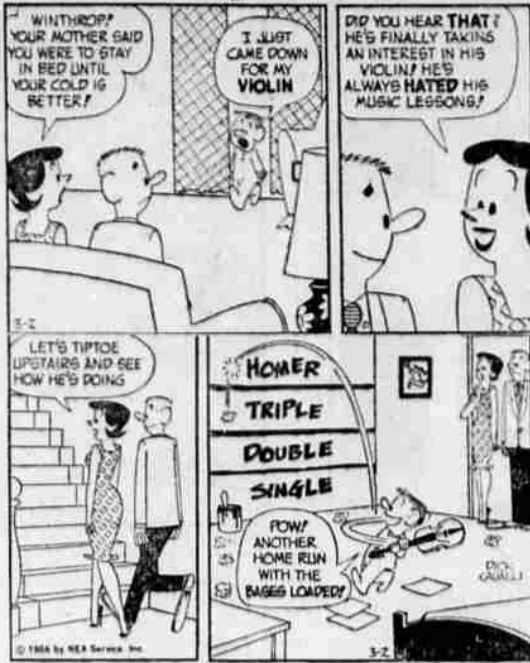

Although the sale of Easter Seals through an intensive mail campaign will cover the state highlight the month-long campaign, there will be other fund-raising activities, including a sale of paper label lilies on the streets of many cities a few days before Easter.

Various civic, fraternal and school groups are expected to participate in special fund-raising activities, Mrs. Snell explained.

The sale of Easter Seals is the society's principal source of revenue and the funds are used to finance various society activities, including the children's hospital school in Eugene, Camp Easter Seal, the state's only summer camp for crippled children, and the Craft Shop of the Handicapped articles made by the physically handicapped, a retail outlet for handicapped.

Parents, University Heads Study Campus Crime Ring

LEXINGTON, Ky. (UP)—Disturbed parents of students studying to be "big time gangsters" met with University of Kentucky officials today on the teenage ring's alleged thefts, bombings and narcotics sales on campus.

The "junior gangsters," a gang of 10 students and two outside youths, were arrested Thursday in a pre-dawn raid on three university dormitories.

The arrests climaxed a long investigation by the university and federal narcotics agents, including one who posed as a student and lived with a gang member. The narcotics agent took a course in criminology.

Since enrollment last September, the gang was alleged to have exploded several home-made bombs in university dormitories, participated in 31 campus thefts, staged storehouse break-ins in downtown Lexington and sold marijuana on campus.

Dean of Men Leslie Martin said the student members of the campus crime incorporated ring "academically speaking, were good students."

"They were above average intelligence," the dean said.

"We came here to be educated to be big time gangsters," they boasted in the undercover agent's two interviews. William Robinson, 18, and Wes Bratcher, 19, both of Louisville, Ky., and an unidentified juvenile were arraigned in police court this morning on grand larceny charges.

Neil Huffman, 18, Louisville, and Edward R. Griggaby, 21, Bulan, Ky., will appear at an examining trial Tuesday on charges of illegally possessing barbiturates.

Police did not identify the five other arrested students who were released after questioning.

The two non-students, Terry Du Pont, 18, and Mitchell Bishop, 18, both of Louisville, were charged with living in university dormitories without the knowledge or consent of the university.

Chicago May Be 'Bombed'

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UP)—Radio disc jockey Allen English, an advocate of the South's segregation pattern, flies to Chicago today to drop 25,000 miniature Confederate battle flags on the city if the weather permits.

The record spinner, employed by station WSUH in Oxford, planned his flight in retaliation for the dropping of copies of the U. S. Constitution over Jackson and Greenwood, Miss. Chicago Negro disc jockey Al Benson sponsored the Mississippi drop to emphasize the

U. S. Supreme Court's school segregation rulings.

English, who landed in Centralia, Ill. because of a snow storm in an attempt Monday, expected better weather on his second flight.

The Oxford, Miss., announcer planned to take off from the Memphis Municipal Airport in a private plane piloted by George Martin of

Sikeston, Mo. The plane was furnished by Memphis airplane dealer Jack Adams who flew the craft Monday but had another flight schedule today.

English said "We'll probably fly non-stop to Chicago" and scatter the flags over the city at noon.

The Weather Bureau said the ceiling at Chicago should be about 8,000 feet and only possible showers were forecast for that area. But he said "we won't let showers stop us."
