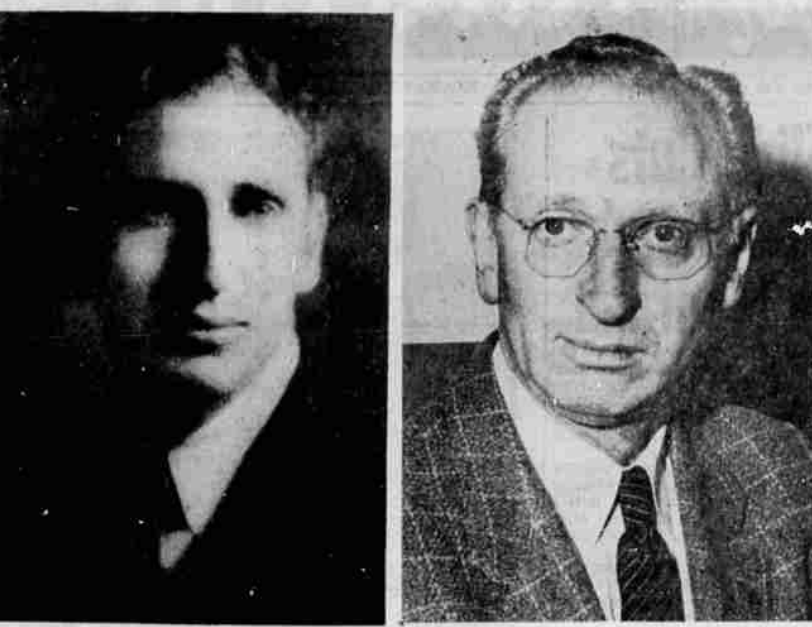

Charlie Mack, who has had a colorful career which took him into many fields, disproved an old axiom of the Fourth Estate — once a newspaperman always a newspaperman.
Mack, now a Klamath Falls florist, became a newspaperman shortly after he was graduated from Oregon State College. From 1931 to 1934 when he was elected Klamath County assessor, Mack served as a reporter and night editor of the Herald and News.
That was a hectic period both on the national and local news scene. During Mack's first year as a news gatherer and editor, here are some of the events that transpired:
HOT NEWS
More than 2,000 banks failed in

the United States.
Even bootleg liquor, the consumption of which had about become the No. 1 national pastime, dropped sharply in price.
Major Gen. Smedley Butler, "stormy petrel" of the U.S. Marines, caused an international incident by hurling an insult at portly Dictator Mussolini of Italy.
Jack (Legs) Diamond, notorious gang leader, was killed by rival hoodlums.
The Scopes so-called "monkey trial" got under way in Tennessee to test a law prohibiting the teaching of Darwin's theory of evolution in that state.
STARTLING EVENTS
These and other startling events kept the young night editor busy. And at home, there was a series of

violent crimes and the town of Dorris burned to the ground.
"It was a great life," Mack declared. "I'd probably still be in the newspaper business, if the political bug hadn't bit me. I still think it was quite a feat to win the assessor election over Bill Lee, who was in the office for 25 years."
Mack served two terms as assessor and then moved to Portland where he acted one year as administrative assistant to Al Bauer, general manager of Henry Kaiser's Oregon Shipbuilding Corporation.
In September, 1943, the ex-newspaper editor was named public and labor relations manager for the Weyerhaeuser Timber Company in Klamath Falls.

U.S. Fishing Boat Rescues Five Pacific Raft Voyagers

LIMA, Peru (UP)—Radio reports reaching Lima today said five raft sailors who came to grief on the "Kon-Tiki" route to the south seas have been picked up by an American fishing boat some 2,000 miles northwest of their starting point in central Peru.
The voyagers, four men and a woman of various European and Latin American nationalities, spent Friday night aboard the rescue Trawler Rehoboth. They will decide today whether to continue their journey.
Amateur radio operators in the U.S. and half a dozen Latin American countries, who had been anxiously following the progress of the search for the log raft Cantuta, heaved a collective sigh of relief when it was located.
After a three-day search, the Rehoboth sighted the raft at 5:19 north latitude, 105:42 west longitude. Rough seas made it impossible to come alongside, so lifeboats were sent to pick up the voyagers.
The Cantuta's crew included Edward Davis, Czech-born, Peruvian head of the expedition; Mirko Gurecki, Czech radio operator; Andy Ross, a Dutchman; Joaquin Guerrero, an Argentine; and Natalia Mazuelos, a Peruvian woman.
They left Peru three months ago hoping to equal the exploits of the Scandinavian scientific team that sailed from that country to the

Marquesas Islands in the long raft "Kon-Tiki."
All went well until a violent Pacific storm swept away their food supply. They radioed appeals for help, and the Rehoboth and the U.S. Naval Transport Greenville, on the way from Pacific ports to Panama, changed course to search for them.
The raft quickly established radio contact with the search ships, but they were unable immediately to locate it. The Rehoboth nearly missed the raft Friday night in a blinding rainstorm, but the rain lifted just in time for the hungry voyagers to sight the Trawler's lights.

Missing Persons Sought By Police

YREKA —The sheriff's office is continuing the search for three missing persons involved in a jeep accident just below Horse Creek store on the Klamath River.
The search has been hampered by the high water, but deputies and a county prisoner work crew are continuing the search of the river and banks.
The missing persons are Jenny Linderman, wife of Paul Linderman whose body has been recovered; Paula Lee Linderman, their daughter; and Robert Allen Erwin, their grandson. The accident occurred on February 19.

Mine Reports Gold Shipments

YREKA —A total of \$798,389.54 in gold and silver bullion was shipped to the U.S. Mint in San Francisco during the year 1955 by the Sixteen mine according to H. B. Chessier president.
The mine records reveal that ore milled during 1955 averaged \$20.27 per ton and average recovery was calculated at about 91 per cent.
The mine is located near Happy Camp. During December the floods forced the mine to close down, but it is expected to reopen about the middle of March.

U. S. Racketeer Drops From Sight

AVELLINO, Italy (P)—Racketeer Joe Adonis who preferred exile in Italy to jail in the United States, is on the move again.
A Naples newspaper reported that Adonis had "disappeared." But police said he had only moved from an aunt's home near Naples to the town of Lucca, near Leghorn.
