4-H Clubs Observe National Week; 'Improving' Theme Set

This week, beginning last Saturday, is National 4-H Club Week. More than 26,500 boys and girls in Oregon are participating in the 4-H program, learning skills for community and home. The theme of this year's 4-H Week observance is "Improving Family and Community Living." Of this 26,500, there are 700 4-H members in Klamath County, and 112 volunteer leaders.

This group works on many different projects in an effort to learn by doing, which 4-H leaders feel is about the best way to learn. Through their projects, the 4-H Club members learn how to use better methods, how to keep better records, and how to serve their communities.

The educational objectives of the

4-H movement are expressed in its name. The H's are Head, Heart, Hands and Health.

These objectives are:
HEAD—To instill in the minds of young people an intelligent understanding and appreciation of nature and the environment in which they live. To teach young people the value of research and to develop in them a scientific attitude toward the problems of farm and home.

HEART—To train young people in cooperative action to the end that they may increase their accomplishments and through associated efforts better assist in solving problems.

HANDS—To help young people to develop desirable ideals and standards for farming, homemaking, community life and citizenship, and a sense of responsibility for their attainment.

HEALTH—To afford young people technical instruction in farming and homemaking, that they may acquire skill and understanding in these fields and a clearer vision of agriculture as a basic industry and homemaking as a worthy occupation.

HEALTH—To develop in young people habits of healthful living, to provide them with information and direction in the intelligent use of leisure, and to arouse in them worthy ambitions and a desire to continue to learn, that they may live fully and richly.

In addition to these objectives, the 4-H movement attempts to give older members a chance to develop leadership ability through becoming junior leaders. The junior leaders learn to conduct meetings, and help adult leaders with some of the numerous jobs in the club work. They also assume other leadership responsibilities.

To be a junior leader, a member must be at least 14 years of age and have two years of 4-H experience.

Klamath County 4-H Club members and leaders look to the club agents, who are a part of a nationwide organization. In Klamath County, the 4-H office, headed by Francis Skinner and Mary McConnell, is located in the post office building.
