STOCKS

WALL STREET NEW YORK UP — The stock market pursued an irregularly low course Wednesday with trading relatively quiet in the late afternoon.

Prices sagged around 2 points at the outside but at the same time there were many gainers, some sizable.

Trading amounted to an estimated 2,900,000 shares for the day as compared with 2,750,000 shares Tuesday when the market was slightly lower.

Ford Motor was the center of all attention at the opening of the market when it made its bow on the New York Stock Exchange. It was moderately active at unchanged to slightly lower prices.

The stock opened on 1,300 shares at 62 and held persistently in a range of 61 3/4 to 62 1/4. It closed Tuesday on the over-the-counter market at 61 3/4 bid and 62 1/4 offered.

Butchers scaling 270 to 330 pounds brought \$11.50 to \$12.00 and 340 to 400 pounds \$11.25 to \$11.50. Sows sold from \$10.00 to \$11.50.
