Dan Doten, 81, a resident of the Klamath Basin for most of his life, died at the Klamath Nursing Home March 7. He was born at Yreka, California, March 13, 1875, to Mr. and Mrs. Josiah Doten, who were early day pioneers of North-

California. The Dotens moved to Keno when Dan was a small child, and he lived in Dorris, Keno and vicinity until ill health forced his retirement several years ago. He was a stage driver on the old Linkville-Ashland and Northern California run for about 14 years, driving the night run over the Green Springs Mountains through deep mud and snow, was a cowpuncher on a large ranch near Dorris, and was post-

master at Keno for 14 years. In the days when game was plentiful and marketing of it legal, Doten did a great deal of duck hunting in the Tule Lake area for the market and was considered one of the best shots in the country.

Survivors include one sister, Mrs. Ruth Rice of Albany, Oregon; two nieces, Mrs. Katherine Tuelbet, Bandon, Oregon, and Mrs. Margie Yoder, Drain, Oregon; one nephew, Merle Manning, Brownsville, Oregon.

Funeral services will be held from O'Hair's Memorial Chapel Saturday, March 10, at 2 p.m. Final rites and interment will be in Klamath Memorial Park.
