## 'Christ' Hopefuls Plague Hollywood Director's Life

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—Director John Farrow begs that any men interested in playing Christ in his film will write him—and not show up on his doorstep or telephone at the crack of dawn.

The movie-maker's announcement he was launching an on-level talent search for an unknown to portray the teacher has made him the most popular man in Hollywood.

"I've been inundated with phone calls," Farrow said today. "One woman from South Dakota called me at home at 6 in the morning. She wanted her husband to play the role of Christ because he is 'Christy by nature.'"

TALL TALES

One man arrived at the director's home and announced he was Christ. Another woman telephoned that, in the Bridget Murphy manner, she had been at the foot of the cross in some previous life.

But Farrow's qualifications rule out most applicants. He admits his search may be limited to theological schools of all faiths.

"I could take a man from a monastery, say, and put him back in again," he said. "I even would like to try to keep the man anonymous although that would not be possible."

The role in "Son of Man," to be filmed in 1957, would mean a screen career for the winner. Farrow will sign him to a 30-year contract for the one picture with the provision the man never act again.

EXPLANATION GIVEN

"I wouldn't want him playing a gangster or slapping Anita Ekberg around in some other movie," said Farrow.

Farrow is one of the nation's experts on theology. He has been writing books on religion for 20 years. He's worked on the "Son of Man" script for three years. It has been approved, he said, by leaders of the Catholic, Protestant, Jewish and Moslem religions.

"This is not the story of any one church," he said. "It is the story of Christ and his teachings. The film will have universal appeal."
