The volunteers wore helmets and 40 pounds of chain mail, and carried shields, battle axes and spears. Their grind covered 30 miles of grass-covered, rutted Posse Way, the old Roman road between Bath and Cirencester. They finished as weary men.

### GOP To Monitor Radio Time

**PORTLAND**—The approaching political campaign led the Republican state organization Saturday to demand answering time for Sen. Morse (D-Ore) does not pay for his weekly broadcasts on many Oregon radio stations.

Wendell Wyatt, Republican state chairman, said if the Morse broadcasts are on a public-service basis, the GOP will demand equal time to answer.

He said he had sent telegrams to 35 Oregon stations, warning that from now on the Republican party would check the broadcasts to determine whether they are paid political programs or public-service broadcasts.

The volunteers, all members of the Surrey Walking Club, were enlisted by the British Broadcasting Corp. The BBC plans to stage a battle of Hastings television program on June 5, and wanted to make sure history isn't being ridiculous about Harold's famous march.

At one stage of the trip a hiker accidentally pinked one of the men, a former Army sergeant, with a spear.

His command of short Saxon words appropriate to this incident, his admiring mates said later, would have done Harold proud.
