STOCKS

WALL STREET — The stock market turned mixed in late afternoon Tuesday after drifting somewhat lower during much of the day.

Reports of higher earnings and dividends and company expansion programs brought selective strength in some issues. Motors and steels were mostly lower, while many other divisions were irregular.

Gains ranged to around two points, while losses generally were held to a point or so.

Trading was running at a pace of around 2,800,000 shares for the day, compared with Monday's 3,100,000 shares. Three straight advances had carried the market into record high territory.

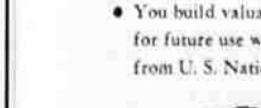

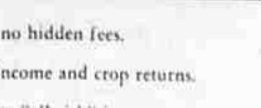
