NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market surged into new high territory Wednesday with all divisions taking part in the upswing in the late afternoon.

Many key issues advanced from one to five points. Copper and steel were pace setters.

Trading ran at around three million shares for the day, compared with Tuesday's 2,700,000 when the market closed a shade below Monday's record high.

The rush to buy coincided with an assortment of encouraging business reports, including higher dividends and record earnings.

Malenkov Flies To England

MOSCOW (AP) — Georgi Malenkov left by plane for Britain Wednesday to tour British power stations.

It is the former Soviet premier's first trip to the Western world. Malenkov and his party of Soviet electrical engineers were to spend the night in East Berlin, then fly on to London Thursday.

Malenkov's mission officially is technical, not political. But he is still a member of the Soviet Union's ruling "collective leadership."

Malenkov's trip and the visit to England next month of Soviet Premier Bulganin and Communist Party boss Khrushchev appear to be part of a concerted Russian effort to win friends and influence people in Britain.

Mass Family Killings Told

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (UP) — A 49-year-old waitress confessed last night she fed fatal doses of ant poison to three of her children, two husbands and mother to collect their insurance.

Police said Mrs. Rhonda Belle Martin signed a statement admitting her relatives' deaths and said she confessed poisoning her present husband, Roland Martin, who is recuperating in a Biloxi, Miss., hospital.

Atty. William Thetford said an "investigation is still continuing" into the deaths of two more of Mrs. Martin's daughters.

Top UCLA Guard Injures Back

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Morris Taft, UCLA's star guard, has suffered a recurrence of the back injury that put him out of action last fall.

Taft said he landed hard on his heels during a practice session and a disc in the lumbar region seemed to have slipped.

Taft has played with his back in a heavy brace all year, but he hasn't missed a game. Coach John Wooden said he didn't know the full extent of the injury but hoped that, as trainer Ducky Drake surmised, the injury might be nothing more than a strained muscle.

New Contract Talks Begin

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Backed by a 95 per cent strike authorization vote, negotiators for 3,500 Western Greyhound bus drivers and station workers resume talks on a new contract with the company Wednesday.

The vote among workers in eight Western states authorized union negotiators to call a strike "if unable to obtain a satisfactory agreement" with Pacific Greyhound Co.

At issue is renewal of a contract which expired March 1. The union is asking a 10 per cent general wage increase, reduction of the station work week from 40 hours to 35, establishment of an employer-paid health and welfare program and paid holidays, improvements in vacations and other fringe benefits.
