## Mrs. Byron Johnson Relates Interest In Red Cross Work

A lifelong interest in swimming and a desire to help in the community programs motivate Mrs. Byron (Archie Mae) Johnson of Malin to serve as a Red Cross volunteer. Mrs. Johnson says:

"I had my first Red Cross swimming training in Dallas, Oregon and earned my lifesaving badge when I was 16 years old. I came to Malin as a bride 18 years ago. My husband has a farm implement business and we live on a ranch east of Malin. I have four boys, David 13, Richard 11, Van 4 and Douglas 2.

"Some years ago our town built a park and swimming pool and holds each spring in the high school pool in Klamath Falls, usually in charge of a representative of the national Red Cross who comes to the chapter each year to train swimming instructors.

All of the Malin pool workers have been trained without charge by the Red Cross. With the exception of two years I have served each summer as a volunteer at the Malin pool. Use of the pool is not restricted to Malin residents, of course, and children from Tulelake, Merrill, Dorris, Heintz and Bonanza have all participated in the swim training program. All teacher material and certificates are furnished by the Red Cross."

Mrs. Johnson also holds an instructor's rating in Red Cross's first aid, and has taught classes for the chapter in Malin, Bonanza and Tulelake.

"The swimming program and the first aid classes are my volunteer service to the community," Mrs. Johnson says, explaining that family responsibilities limit her activities. "In addition to the satisfaction of doing something worthwhile and important, I enjoy working with the children in the swimming program. I like the sport and in fact I have just as much fun as the children!"

## Irene Curie Dies In Paris

PARIS (AP)—Mme. Irene Curie, Nobel prize winning physicist and daughter of the discoverers of radium, died Saturday, she was 85.

She died in a Paris hospital. The announcement did not disclose the cause of death. She was the daughter of Pierre and Marie Curie, who gained world renown with their discovery of radium. She and her husband, Frederic Joliot of Paris, were awarded the Nobel prize in chemistry in 1935 for the discovery of artificial radioactivity.

After World War II both Mrs. Joliot-Curie and her husband were widely criticized for alleged pro-Communist activities.

The French government ousted her from its atomic energy commission in 1951. Her husband had been removed as head of the body a year earlier because of his Communist associations.

In 1954, the American Chemical Society rejected Mme. Joliot-Curie's application for membership on belief she was a Communist.

When she was detained briefly at Ellis Island in 1948 upon her arrival in the United States for a lecture tour she said she was sympathetic to communism "in many things," but she denied she was a Communist.
