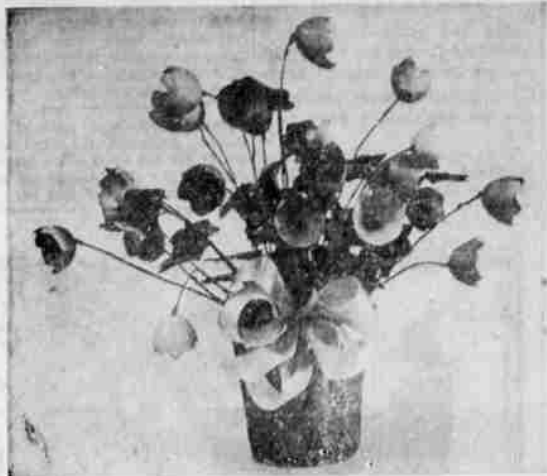




EGG SHELLS, tinted with Easter egg dyes, were used by Mrs. A. L. Dorlaque of Mount Shasta, to make this lasting flower arrangement. Mrs. Dorlaque, president of the Klamath Falls Garden Club, demonstrated use of colored egg shells in making nut cups, favors and flowers at the March 5 meeting. To make blossoms, the eggs are broken (and whites and yolks saved for baking) and the shells cut while still damp. After they are dyed and dried, a wire stem (finished inside the egg with a knot of fuff) is threaded through the half shell and wrapped with green florist tape. "Poke the hole in the end of the shell from the outside in," cautioned Mrs. Dorlaque, "to avoid breaking the dry shell."

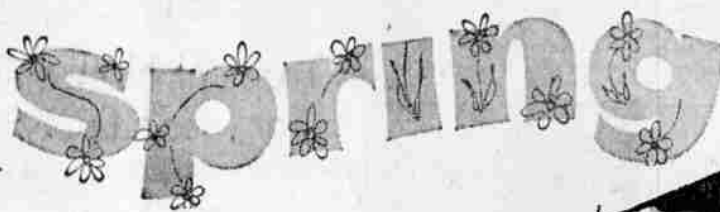
SEVEN CLEVER COOKERS OF MALIN
