PARTY FARE

When arranging your first card party of the Spring, plan the decor for lightness and gaiety. Use the whitest, daintiest china you own, the brightest, greenest tablecloth in your linen closet. As to the refreshments you offer your guests, why, they should be delectably, delightfully different!

The Pineapple Cheese Squares pictured here are delectable in their combination of fruit flavors—lemon and pineapple; they are delightful in their contrast of textures—the smoothness of the pudding and of the cottage cheese, a counterpoint to the crispness of crushed graham crackers.

The use of a package of lemon pudding and pie filling mix in the preparation of the squares makes all the difference in the world, so far as ease and practicality goes. A second recipe using a package of lemon pudding and pie filling mix (picture not shown) is for Lemon Pie Surprises. This illustrates the versatility of the lemon mix, as well as its genuine lusciousness.

PINEAPPLE CHEESE SQUARES
1 package lemon pudding and pie filling mix
2 cup sugar
1 cup water
1 egg, unbeaten
2-3 cup light cream
1 pound cottage cheese, sieved
2-3 cup drained canned crushed pineapple

6 graham crackers, finely crushed
Combine pudding mix, sugar, and 1/4 cup of the water in saucepan. Add egg and blend well. Then add cream and remaining 1/2 cup water. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a full boil and is thickened—about 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Cool only about 5 minutes, stirring once or twice. Fold in sieved cottage cheese and pineapple, blending well.

Sprinkle half of the graham cracker crumbs in bottom of 9x9x2-inch pan or 10x6-inch pan. Pour lemon mixture over crumbs. Sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Chill. Cut in squares. Makes 8 servings.

COLOGNE

When a cologne first was brought on the market, it meant the citrus type of fragrant "water" first created in the city of Cologne, Germany. When shaving lotions first were brought out, they too contained this citrus ingredient. It was not until the late 1920's that the product now known and accepted as cologne came into being. The first of these were called "perfume colognes" to distinguish them from the citrus type. This was a misnomer to a certain extent because too many women thought that if it were a "perfume cologne" it was almost as strong as perfume, which certainly is not the case. There still are many citrus type colognes on the market which enjoy great popularity.

Their use? As an after bath rub—the freshness of the fragrance is particularly appealing first thing in the morning. It is appealing, too, to the person who is ill, whether at home or in a hospital. The fragrance is light and clear and clean-smelling.

On a hot day, or at four o'clock in the afternoon when a person hits a low ebb, a splash of citrus cologne across the forehead gives a lift. There is no medical reason for this, yet it does have a refreshing effect. Anyone who has tried it knows that it tends to have a quality of healing the spirits.

HOW TO USE COLOGNE
Since this is usually the lightest form of fragrance, it is used lavishly in any of the following manners:

1. Splash or "slather" on the body after the bath or at any time when you want a refreshing "lift."
2. Use it on the hair as a quick wave set. It dries very quickly and gives the hair a delightful fragrance—men love it when dancing with a girl who has "hair that smells good." The alcohol can dry out the hair if it is used too

often on very dry hair. However, this may be overcome by using one of the good cream sets or hair pomades. After a shampoo, while the hair is still wet, "douse on" some cologne. Then set the hair and, as the cologne dries into the hair, the scent lingers for many hours. If a woman has a cold and might catch more cold by washing her hair, she may saturate cotton with her cologne and "wipe off" surface soil.
3. Spray it in the clothes and linen closets, in the foyer, in the bathroom. This is part of expressing a woman's personality in the home through her fragrance. Some women even spray the air of the living room. It gives a light, diffused scent to the air.
4. Apply cologne to wrists and temples for a refreshing effect when in a smoky, "close" room—or on warm, muggy days.

5. Hands moist and sticky? Smooth cologne on the palms and between the fingers—it serves a double purpose; the alcohol helps evaporate perspiration and your hands will be beautifully scented.

6. Before going to bed at night smooth cologne on the throat, along your arms, at all spots where perspiration is likely to gather. It helps to relax you and the pleasant fragrance will wait you off to dreamland.

7. Been on your feet a long time today? Rub cologne on your ankles, feet and between the toes. A massaging motion will help to stimulate the blood circulation—and the alcohol will take away that "hot" feeling of tired feet.
