

Union Local Refuses Order

PITTSBURGH (AP)—A 6,500-member union local has refused to return to work at the Westinghouse Electric Corp. plant in nearby Sharon, bringing from the company a charge that ended the 18-day, nationwide strike against Westinghouse.

Local 617 of the AFL-CIO International Union of Electrical Workers (IUE) voted last night not to return to work pending a discussion of the status of nine Sharon employees suspended by the company for alleged picket line violence.

The local's action was taken after the company announced it planned to call some 4,500 members back to the Sharon transformer plant today.

Most of the 44,000 IUE members were returning to work gradually in 29 other plants under terms of the five-year contract agreed to Monday night.

The company planned to meet today with representatives of the independent United Electrical Workers, representing 10,500 Westinghouse employees at 10 other plants still struck. It was hoped the smaller union would agree to a pact similar to that accepted by the IUE.

The settlement with the IUE included a provision dealing with 36 workers who had been fired for alleged picket line violence during the strike.

Kefauver Raps GOP Themes

GREAT FALLS, Mont. (AP)—"Peace and prosperity is the theme of the Republican campaign this year," Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) said last night, "but the peace is uneasy and so is the prosperity."

The senator, bolstered by his unexpected Minnesota primary victory, moved westward today to start an intensive campaign for California's 68 votes at the Democratic National Convention.

He referred in his Great Falls speech to a Lincoln Day talk by Vice President Nixon who, Kefauver said, "bragged about the Republicans providing the biggest tax cut in history."

"They did it," he told a Democratic dinner, "but let me point out that without the tax cut we could have had a balanced budget every year of the Eisenhower administration. We could have made a substantial reduction in the national debt and we could have had an air force superior to any in the world."

Kefauver also charged the Eisenhower administration "obviously does not believe in the possibility of peace. It has utterly failed to prepare for it."

"The people of the world yearn for peace, yet this administration has prepared not a single prop for our economy in case the time comes when we can safely turn swords into plowshares," he said. "As a matter of cold fact, if the Soviet Union would today make a concrete and acceptable offer of peaceful relations it would be the most shattering blow which could be delivered to the economy of the United States."

Varied Victory Reaction Told

Oregon Democratic leaders put varying interpretations on the meaning of Sen. Estes Kefauver's upset victory over Adlai Stevenson in Tuesday's Minnesota presidential primary.

Mrs. Lillian Burton, a long-time Kefauver supporter, said it was "exactly as I predicted. I'll say Kefauver will now take any primary he enters."

Stevenson Supporters Set Fight To Regain Lost Ground

MINNEAPOLIS (AP)—Supporters of Adlai Stevenson, rebounding from the initial shock of his surprise loss to Sen. Estes Kefauver in the Minnesota presidential pri-

mary, regrouped today for an all-or-nothing drive to regain lost ground. Admitting he was no longer a "front runner," Stevenson said last night in Chicago he has no intention of withdrawing from the presidential race and will "go to the Democratic convention seeking the nomination."

But he disavowed any interest in the vice presidency—an idea bandied by Kefauver backers in the flush of their lopsided Minnesota victory. "I am now prepared to work harder than ever... and ask my kind friends everywhere to redouble their efforts too," Stevenson said at a news conference. Sen. Kefauver (D-Tenn.), holder of 26 of 30 Minnesota delegate

votes at the Democrats' August convention, reiterated at Great Falls, Mont., his belief that the primary outcome represented a revolt against the administration's farm program.

The Tennessee senator, moving on to San Francisco today, said he would discuss there the possibility of his entering the Indiana presidential primary, whose filing deadline is a week away.

Stevenson won only the 5th Congressional District—Minneapolis and, with 60 remote precincts still missing, was ahead of Kefauver, 30,559 to 29,689, in the 8th Duluth-iron range country. This put Stevenson into an 870-vote lead there. If his lead holds, he would claim four delegates all told.

The Duluth News-Tribune said

the missing precincts were mostly in St. Louis County, which voted preponderantly for Stevenson, and that it did not expect the few missing ballots to affect the end result.

Stephen A. Mitchell, a leader of the "rebound" forces, said the Minnesota outcome should "wake up" Stevenson supporters who had thought the Democratic presidential campaign was "in the bag" for him.
