Lumber Meet In Second Day

PORTLAND (AP)—The 45th annual convention of the West Coast Lumbermen's Assn. went into its second day Thursday with the nominating report due on the floor.

Scheduled speakers included N. B. Gustina, president of the association; Lawrence D. Krillog, Alexandria, La., president of the National Lumber Manufacturers Assn.; Ralph E. Clark, Washington, D. C., of the Assn. of American Railroads; and Oregon's Gov. Elmo Smith.

At Wednesday's session, the association recommended an industry-wide freight car routing and loading speedup to ease the shortage felt in Oregon every summer. The 250 members from Oregon, Washington, California and British Columbia also gave their unanimous consent to new lumber grading procedures which went into effect last week for all West Coast fir, hemlock, cedar and spruce.

Mt. Shasta Log Operations Begin

MOUNT SHASTA—Logging operations began for the Mount Shasta Pine Manufacturing Company this week, according to Robert Kohn, general manager. This will assure a continuous operation of the mill without a spring layoff, Kohn said, as new logs will be ready for processing before the present three week supply of old logs is exhausted.

Initial work in the woods this year is logging the Moulton tract near Black Butte and road work on the Black Fox Mountain. Operation of the box factory has been discontinued, Kohn said, but if marketing conditions remain stable, particularly in the east, the mill will continue in full production indefinitely.
