YMCA Leadership Training Sessions Held In Klamath

A series of leadership training workshops on work with teen-agers were held last week at the Klamath Falls YMCA and in private homes. The sessions were under the direction of Mrs. Dean Proffitt, Olympia, Washington. Mrs. Proffitt, director of youth work in the Olympia YMCA and active in Washington youth movements, stressed that the task of the YMCA is to train new leaders—both adults and youth—in accepting responsibility and meeting their and others needs in local and world affairs. Many specific program tools were pointed out to help the adviser in his job. Particular reference was made by Mrs. Proffitt to a national study made on "Hi-Y Today" which clearly indicates the strengths and weaknesses of the program. Three aids which can be used to improve the effectiveness of Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y clubs were discussed at the meetings. They were: McCleery attitude scale, christian education goals and a group interest finder. These tests will be used by the local YMCA teen-age clubs in 1956-57. The youth as an individual comes to the group in need of fellowship—acknowledging and respecting the discipline required to properly conduct group activities, Mrs. Proffitt stated. The youth takes a necessary part in a pattern of successful group enterprises which aid in developing his self-confidence. By joining the Y groups his place in the world of youth will be made more secure and his sense of discipline and justice is emphasized, said Mrs. Proffitt. The sessions included members of Hi-Y, Tri-Hi-Y council, club advisers, mothers of members.

Tooth Of Giant China Ape Found

LONDON (AP)—The Chinese scientist who discovered the "Peking Man" reported Monday finding the tooth of another giant ape who roamed China in prehistoric times. Peiping Radio said Dr. Pei Wen Chung made the new discovery in a cave in Tahnin county, Kwangsi Province. It was described as "fossil of a giant ape, four times the size of a man's tooth." Dr. Pei was quoted: "We may say that a kind of ape, far bigger than man, lived in Kwangsi hundreds of thousands of years ago... We are now studying under what conditions and circumstances the giant ape grew to such huge proportions."

Furniture Deal Told

HONOLULU (AP)—Dave Beck says the Teamsters Union's Executive Board conceived a plan to buy the furniture in Beck's Seattle home, and leave it for Beck's use. Here for an Executive Board meeting, Beck said Sunday: "It was the board's idea—not mine. It doesn't mean a thing to me." The Teamsters president added he did not think it would be an issue at the board meeting. Last year the Teamsters Union paid Beck \$163,000 for his Seattle home, then said he could live in it for life.

Beck ridiculed the latter figure Sunday. "I haven't even had it appraised," he said. "I may never get around to having it appraised." He added he would go before the 1957 Teamster convention "if there is any trouble on the thing," but he said the question would not come up at the board meeting.
